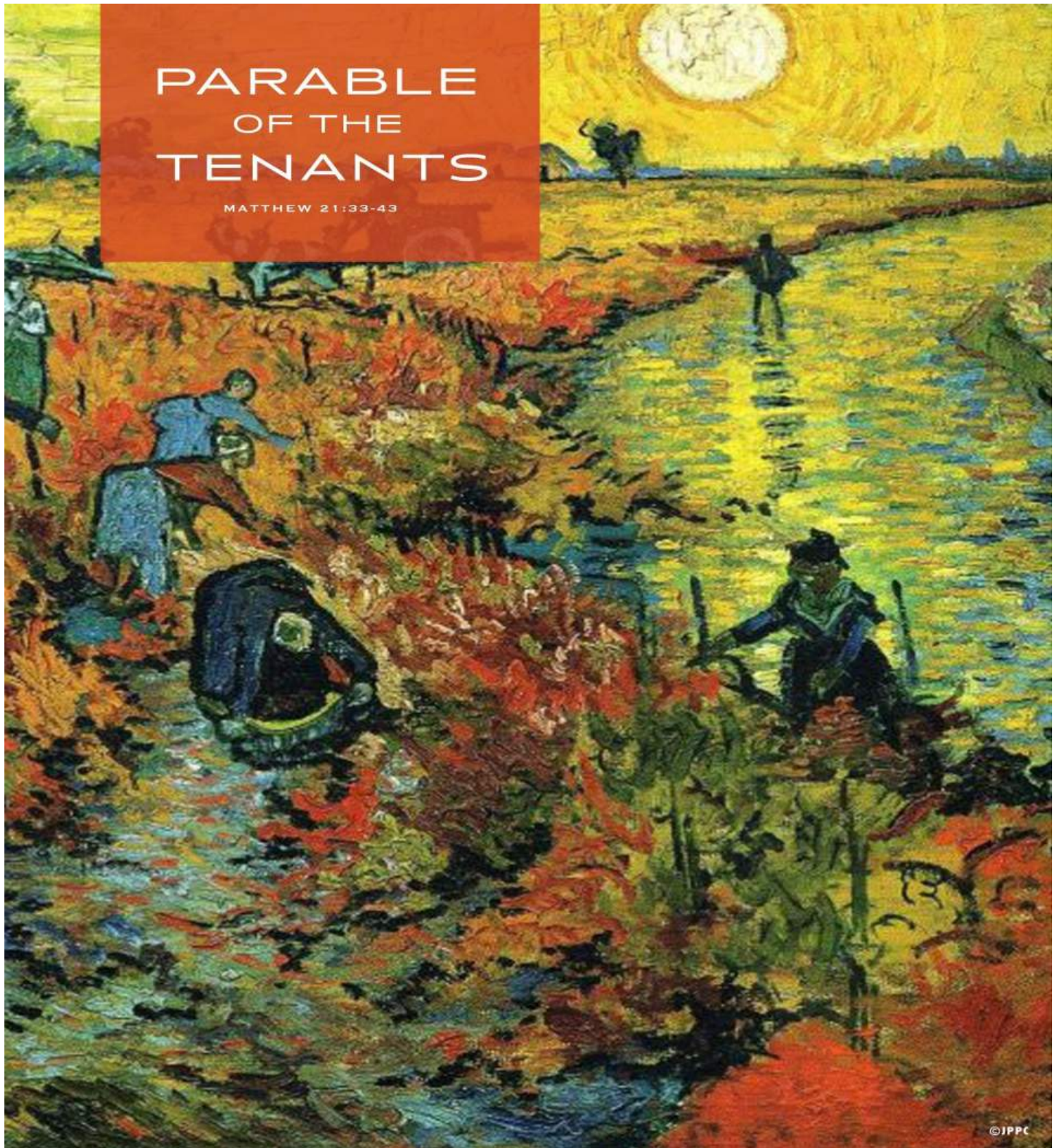

PASTOR'S CORNER

"Lord, let your face shine upon us."

The image of the vineyard in the Bible is a powerful one. The people of the Old Testament were like a vineyard that God planted, nourished, and cultivated so that it could grow and prosper. When God came looking for its fruits - in the form of living in harmony with His will, acts of compassion, and moral integrity - He found little or no results. The people continued to draw from the soil of God's love, yet gave nothing back. In order to motivate His people, God did something extraordinary. He sent his Son into the vineyard; yet His Son met a violent end.

By our Baptism, we all have become part of God's vineyard. God protects and shelters us by the walls of His commandments and the teaching of Jesus. He graces our lives through the sacraments of the Church. He expects us to produce the fruits of mercy and compassion, especially for the innocent and weakest among us. Yet, we live in a nation where there is no mercy for the unborn; no compassion for the sick victims of misplaced mercy through assisted suicide. The walls of God's commandments have been breached by a secular culture that has no moral compass; no boundaries; no ethics grounded in God's revelation.

St. Paul reminds us: "Think again about things like truth, purity, and justice, and keep on doing what you have learned and received, and you'll know God's peace." Let us pray that we all will give back to God a rich harvest of justice and mercy that respects all human life from conception to natural death. We pray:

"Lord, take care of this vineyard and protect what your right hand has planted; restore us and if your face shines upon us, we will be saved."

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$422,176.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$321,321. Of the 231 families who have pledged, 162 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you enjoyed our new air conditioning system in the Church in summer. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we are in the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.



In this year of reviving our devotion to the Eucharist and encouraging everyone to return to Mass, we will offer weekly meditations, reflections, and poetry from various saints and authors on the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, which is "the source and summit of the Christian life." Excerpts are taken from the book *The Holy Hour*, a Word on Fire publication.



Catechism 1378: "Worship of the Eucharist"

In the Liturgy of the Mass, we express our faith in the Real Presence of Christ under the species of bread and wine by, among other ways, genuflecting or bowing deeply, as a sign of adoration of the Lord. "The Catholic Church has always offered and still offers to the sacrament of the Eucharist the cult of Adoration, not only during Mass, but also outside of it, reserving the consecrated Hosts with the utmost care, exposing them to the solemn veneration of the faithful, and carrying them in procession."

Our parish is celebrating a special devotion called Forty Hours on October 22-23-24. Services will begin at 7:00pm each of these evenings. Forty Hours devotion is an ancient devotion praising & honoring the Lord Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist. This devotion was introduced to the United States by Saint John Neumann, 4th Bishop of Philadelphia, in 1853. The Forty Hours devotion consists of Songs, Prayers, Reflections on God's Word, and Benediction. On Tuesday, the closing night, there is a special procession around the Church with the Blessed Sacrament, symbolizing the call of Jesus "to come and follow me."

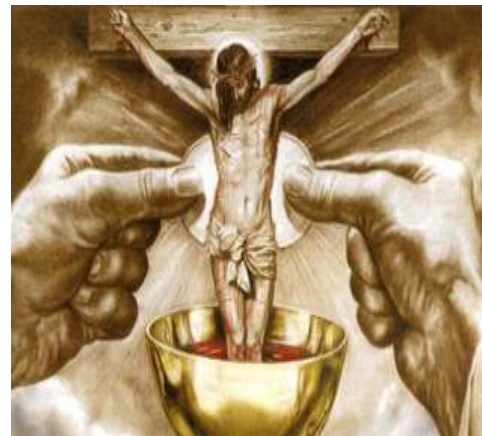
We are asking our families to come and participate in some or all of these devotions. It is one way to give thanks and praise to God for all His love. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is present in a special way in the Holy Eucharist. The World Mission collection assists the Holy Father in proclaiming the Gospel and celebrating the Sacraments in over 1,110 mission dioceses and areas that are in need of resources. PARISH SYNODAL SURVEY

During Lent 2023, St. Hilary Parish participated in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's Synodal Process by executing a parish-wide survey, called the Disciple Maker Index. Thanks to everyone who participated in the survey. The Parish Council & Father Murray reviewed the results, and after much reflection, developed three goals to address some of the areas of improvement identified in the survey. The three goals, as well as planned actions, are as follows:

1. Increase Family Participation in the Mass

- starting in September, we will begin adjusting the homily of the 10am Mass to gear more toward families & kids

- we recently installed a small bookshelf with religious books in the vestibule for young children; we invite the parents with small children to "borrow" a book from this bookshelf during Mass

- we will also be investigating purchasing children's Mass missalettes to add to our pews sometime in late 2023 or early 2024

2. Create a more vibrant and nurturing Parish community

- increase the use of Social Media to advertise parish events (now have a parish Facebook, Instagram, Twitter)

- increase the number of "Fellowship Sundays" after Sunday Mass to encourage parishioner socialization

- resume Mens' and Womens' Retreats, which were paused during the COVID-19 pandemic

3. Increase Parish Almsgiving

- add an Outreach Council bulletin board in the church vestibule to highlight current outreach activities and opportunities

- Embed outreach activities throughout the parish (e.g. PREP, other committees, etc.)

We hope you join us in embracing these goals and associated changes to help us make St. Hilary of Poitiers an even more welcoming and vibrant Parish Community! Thanks!

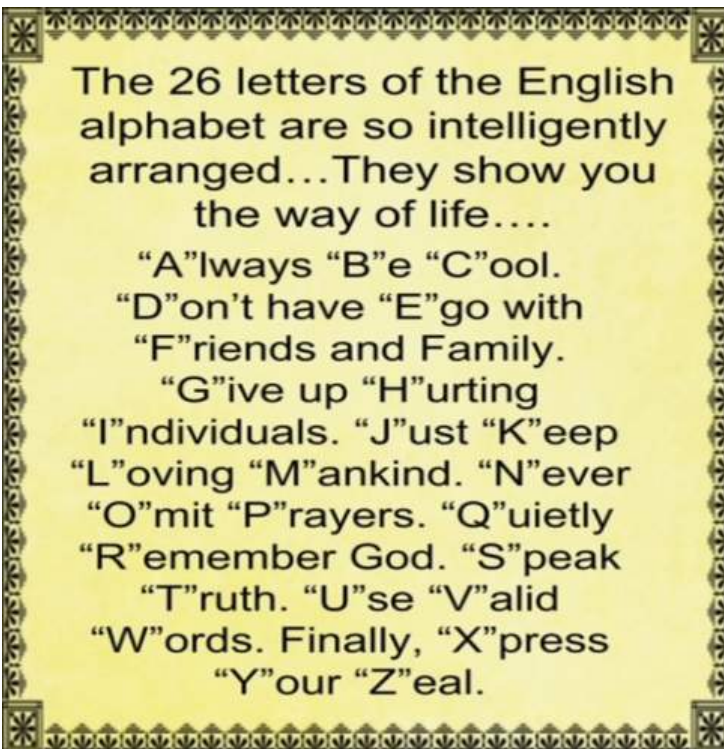
ST. HILARY PARISH CYO BASKETBALL
