PASTOR'S CORNER

“The Son of Man will come”

Advent is a time to pause and contemplate the most pivotal event in all of history. God became flesh and blood for our salvation. It was an extravagant gesture of love and mercy. Yet it was an event that many never noticed or cared about. In the gospel, Jesus calls us to wake up; He came once and is coming again. He uses the example of Noah building the ark. Many laughed at him; his friends turned away and even his own family thought him insane. Then it began to rain for forty days and nights. Everything was thrown into chaos, yet Noah and his family were saved.

Advent is our time to rebuild and repair the ark of our faith. God has supplied the materials - the ten commandments, the teachings of Jesus. Its sails will be powered by the breath of the Holy Spirit. As in the days of Noah, the same is true in the days of the coming of Jesus. Many will say such a project is a waste of time; out of step with conventional wisdom. The world calls us into the market places; the Church is calling us into the Holy places. Isaiah's call is "Climb the mountains of the Lord." Is God the highest mountain in our lives? What priority does He have in our lives?

In these chaotic times, the flood waters of immorality and disrespect for authority, as well as mocking of faith values, are rising. Heed the wisdom and warnings of Scripture. Keep building our ark. The ark of a faith-filled life will be our salvation. Faith is our salvation and enables us to keep our heads above water. Then the day of the Lord will be for us a day of rejoicing and gladness.



ADVENT BEGINS!
November 27 - December 24



Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent (from "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas. From the earliest days of the Church, people have been fascinated by Jesus' promise to come back. But the Scripture readings during Advent tell us not to waste our time with predictions. Advent is not about speculation. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world. Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.

Some suggestions for this 1st Week of Advent in preparing for the Lord:

- Sunday** ~ Buy or make an Advent wreath. Light the first violet candle for Hope.
- Monday** ~ Decide how to prepare for Jesus' birth during Advent....deeper prayer, acts of charity, fasting, etc.
- Tuesday** ~ Make a playlist of music appropriate for Advent that anticipates Christ's birth. Listen and meditate to it until Christmas.
- Wednesday** ~ St. Andrew answered Jesus' call and led others to Him. Pray for those discerning the priesthood or religious life.
- Thursday** ~ Ask God to reveal what's keeping you from fully experiencing His love. Resolve to deal with it by Christmas.
- Friday** ~ Attend Mass or visit Jesus in the Eucharist in Church. Give thanks for His blessings.
- Saturday** ~ Set up a nativity. Leave it empty and add the figures slowly through the weeks.

The goal of a Catholic Liturgy is to Communicate a transcendent awareness of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. Faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist demands great beauty, dignity, and reverence".



All of us have the responsibility to bring beauty, reverence and dignity to our celebration of Mass. The church directs us to do this in very simple and concrete ways:

- to receive the Eucharist, one must be in a state of Grace; serious sin must be confessed before receiving Holy Communion.
- fast from food at least one (1) hour before receiving Holy Communion; exceptions taking medication or other health issues.
- bodily demeanor, gestures & dress ought to convey respect as Christ becomes our guest.
- a simple bow before receiving Holy Communion and responding Amen.
- quiet reflection when returning to the pew acknowledging Christ's presence, and words of praise and thanksgiving and petitioning the Lord to answer our many needs. Leaving Church after receiving is not appropriate.
- to remember we are to become what we receive... how do we reflect the spirit of the Eucharist in our relationships, choices and decisions.
- be mindful of Christ's continuing presence in the Tabernacle; if able, genuflect entering and leaving Church or a simple bow is appropriate for those who cannot genuflect.

Reverence, dignity, beauty... simple ways we all can proclaim our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.
