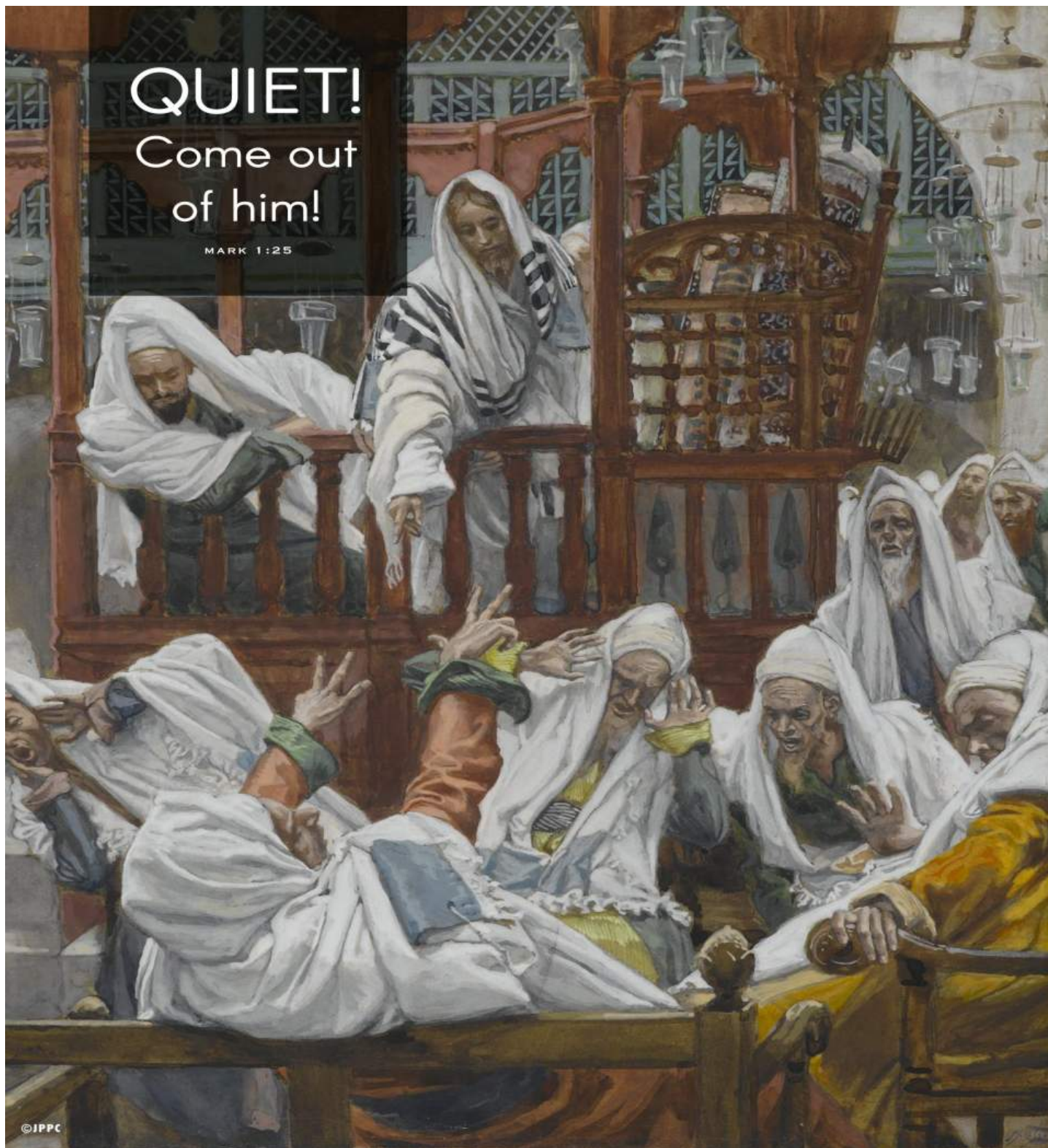

PASTOR'S CORNER

-- Mark 1:21-28

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$427,176.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$345,208. Of the 231 families who have pledged, 165 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you enjoyed our new air conditioning system in the Church in summer. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we are in the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.



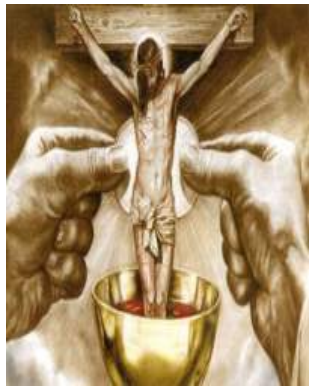

BACK TO THE BASICS

Resolutions, it seems, are made to be broken. Some folks poke fun at this reality by proposing New Year's vows that are, shall we say, attainable. Here are a few from social media:

- * Wave to fellow motorists at stoplights.
- * Sign up for a marathon. Don't run it.
- * Stop procrastinating - tomorrow.
- * Get lost without any help from Siri.
- * Unfriend everyone on Facebook who posts their workout regimen.

The concept of a fresh start, however, can be serious business. The exiled people of Judah desperately needed one. Just over two decades into their seventy-year captivity, God brought encouragement to them through the prophet Ezekiel, promising, "I will now restore the fortunes of Jacob." (Ezekiel 39:25)

But the nation first needed to return to the basics - the instructions God had given to Moses eight hundred years earlier. This included observing a feast at the new year. For the ancient Jewish people, that began in early spring. A major purpose of their festivals was to remind them of God's character and His expectations. He told their leaders, "Give up your violence and oppression and do what is just and right" and he insisted on honesty. (Ezek. 45:9-10)

The lesson applies to us, too. Our faith must be put into practice or it's worthless (James 2:17). In this new year, as God provides what we need, may we live out our faith by returning to the basics: "Love the Lord your God." and "Love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37-39)

"The Samaritans Choice - An Act of Love"

On January 11th, the Office for Life & Family Archdiocese of Philadelphia, in partnership with the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, American Association, launched an Anti-Human Trafficking Winter Awareness Program entitled: "The Samaritans Choice - An Act of Love." The program formally concludes on the World Day of Prayer and Reflection against Human Trafficking on February 8th. This educational program is designed to stem the tide of human trafficking in our local community by teaching individuals how to identify the signs, how to report it, and how to support survivors. You can participate in this by praying daily:

Holy Spirit, reach deep into my heart, instill in me the gifts of Wisdom, Knowledge and Fortitude in my desire to serve you by doing what I can to help abolish this scourge of modern human slavery, a most egregious sin against humanity. I pray that every victim be freed and every survivor be healed. I seek the intercession of Blessed St. Josephine Bakhita whom you blessed with compassion for others. May her prayers comfort and strengthen me in my resolve and provide relief and healing for the women, men, and children enslaved in this scourge who long for their freedom. I pray for the transformation and the conversion of heart for those who see other human beings as property to be used as a matter of profit, possession or pleasure, inflicting ineffable pain and grief on the most vulnerable amongst us. Sow in me the love to stand at the foot of the cross with others to be agents of change in the world so that together, we can be the voice of the voiceless. I ask this through Christ Lord Jesus, who lives and reigns with You and God the Father, One God, forever and ever. Amen.

Why "The Samaritans Choice - An Act of Love"? The story of the Good Samaritan was chosen because it speaks to us today as much as it did when first given to us over 2000 years ago. In it, we learn of the 4 players: the victim, priest, Levite, and Samaritan. It was the Samaritan that stopped and gave 3 things to the stranger - his time to tend to him; talent as he helped his wounds; treasure as he provided for ongoing care. This is what the winter program is all about... recognizing the wounded soul, giving of your time, talent and treasure to come to the aid of the those being exploited through enslavement. Central to this program is building awareness so we can broaden our perspective of the pro-life movement, to see the scourge of Modern Human Slavery, commonly referred to as human trafficking, for what it really is - a Pro-Life issue. It is about the dignity of life that lies within each of us. According to the World Council for Health in Southeast Asia, two-thirds of the victims of child sex trafficking undergo forced abortions. Survivors in the US speak to being forced to have multiple abortions.

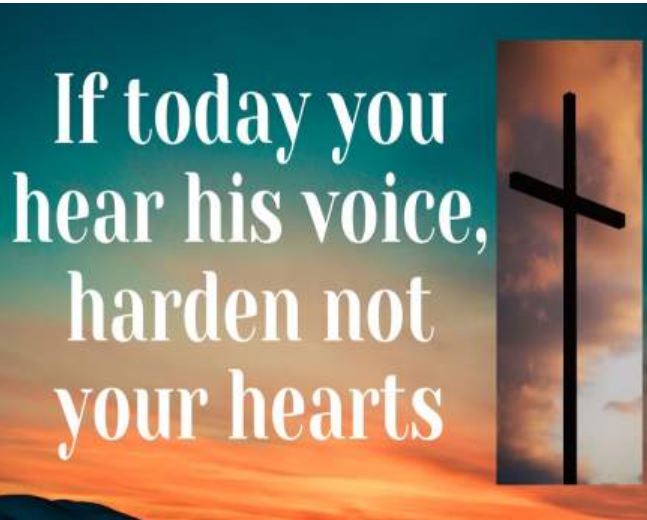
