PASTOR'S CORNER

"Rejoice Always"

The word "rejoice" fills the pages today in the Scriptures. Isaiah says, "I rejoice heartily in the Lord. My soul rejoices in the Lord." Mary says, "My soul rejoices in the Lord." St. Paul adds to the fervor, "Rejoice always." What makes their call for rejoicing more incredible is that each of these figures knew the trials and tribulations of life. Isaiah was persecuted for his faith, and Paul wrote from a prison cell. Mary went through the death of her husband and lived to see her Son put to death.

Yet despite all their troubles, they held onto hope...the hope that God was real and he would provide a way through the twists and turns as well as the ups and downs of life. This hope was realized in the birth of Jesus Christ. Hope and joy became flesh and blood.

In the gospel today, John the Baptist cautions us not to overlook "one among you whom you do not recognize." In the busyness of life and the confusing times in which we live, allow the joy and hope to embrace us with new-found confidence. Joy and hope are in the here and now, no matter the circumstances of our present situation. Joy and hope are found in a person, the Son of Mary, the Son of God, Jesus Christ. May the Lord bless us with faith-filled eyes to recognize His presence among us, especially in the breaking of the bread. May the life we live point others toward that joy and hope that never diminishes.

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

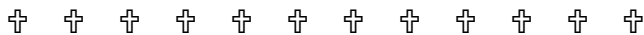


This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$422,176.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$326,156. Of the 231 families who have pledged, 163 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you enjoyed our new air conditioning system in the Church in summer. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we are in the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.

NEW SCHEDULE FOR SUNDAY MASS STARTING IN 2024

I am grateful for all of you who have returned to Mass after the pandemic. I hope and pray that more of our parishioners will return to Mass as well. There is nothing like being there! Watching Mass on TV no longer fulfills the Sunday obligation, unless you are sick, elderly, have an emergency or have conflicts with work schedules. With this in mind, please note our new Mass Schedule beginning in January 2024:

Catholics Can Receive a Plenary Indulgence by Praying before a Nativity Scene (by Francesca Pollio Fenton)

This year, Catholics will be able to receive a plenary indulgence from Dec. 8 to Feb. 2, 2024 by praying before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan Church. As part of the celebration of this Franciscan Centenary, the Conference of the Franciscan Family asked Pope Francis for the approval of this plenary indulgence. The conference wrote, "In order to promote the spiritual renewal of the faithful and increase the life of grace, we ask that the faithful receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions from Dec. 8, 2023 to Feb.2, 2024, by visiting the churches run by Franciscan families throughout the world and stopping in prayer in front of the Nativity scenes set up there." Those who are sick or unable to participate physically can obtain the indulgence by offering their sufferings up to the Lord or by "carrying out practices of piety."

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary, and all the saints to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin. However, it must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin, even venial. Sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the pope is an additional condition. It is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed. One sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences. However for each plenary indulgence one wishes to receive, a separate reception of the Eucharist and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.

THE LEGEND OF THE CANDY CANE



The **hard candy** reminds us that *Jesus is our rock.* (Psalm 61:2)

The **cane shape** reminds us of a *shepherd's staff* and the shepherd that came to worship Jesus. It also reminds us of how Jesus came into the world to be a shepherd of his people. (Luke 2:8-15 and John 10:11)

The upside-down candy cane forms the **letter "J"** and reminds us of the name of *Jesus* which means "God saves." (Matthew 1:21)

The **peppermint flavor** reminds us of the *gift of spices* from the Wise Men. (Matthew 2:11)

The **white candy** reminds us of *purity and holiness.* It recalls the virgin birth of Christ, the sinless life of Christ and the holy life that Jesus wants his people to live. (Matthew 1:23 and 1 Peter 1:15)

The **color red** reminds us that *Jesus became a real flesh and blood man* and spilled his blood to save his people. (Hebrews 2:14)

The **stripes** remind us of the *lashes Jesus received* when he suffered for us and ultimately bore our sins that we might be healed. (1 Peter 2:24-25)

The faithful are bound to observe the obligation of Holy Mass for a Sunday as usual for the 4th Sunday of Advent. The faithful are bound to observe the obligation of Holy Mass for Christmas at the Vigil Mass or on Christmas Day. **Thus, the faithful have two obligations back-to-back.** The Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord is always a holy day of obligation, even if it falls on a Monday or a Saturday. The Solemnity of Mary on Jan. 1st is not observed as a holy day of obligation this year, since it falls on a Monday.*
