UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$421,276.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$318,231.50. Of the 230 families who have pledged, 161 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you are enjoying our new air conditioning system in the Church. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we enter the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.

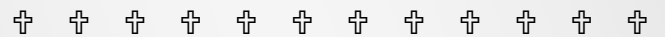

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION AT ST. HILARY CHURCH



Our Monday Eucharistic Adoration will begin again this Monday, Sept. 11 from 8:30am to 4pm. We encourage all to spend time with the Lord, and be aware of His Real Presence in the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist.

Bishop Barron reminds us that "sitting before the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is like a body exposing itself before the sun to absorb its rays. It is like having a private conversation between friends." So come before the Lord and receive the healing rays of His graces.

PARISH SYNODAL SURVEY

During Lent 2023, St. Hilary Parish participated in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's Synodal Process by executing a parish-wide survey, called the Disciple Maker Index. Thanks to everyone who participated in the survey. The Parish Council & Father Murray reviewed the results, and after much reflection, developed three goals to address some of the areas of improvement identified in the survey. The three goals, as well as planned actions, are as follows:

1. Increase Family Participation in the Mass

- starting in September, we will begin adjusting the homily of the 10am Mass to gear more toward families & kids

- in early September, we will install a small bookshelf with religious books in the vestibule for young children; we invite parents with small children to "borrow" a book from this bookshelf during Mass

- we will also be investigating purchasing children's Mass missalettes to add to our pews sometime in late 2023 or early 2024

2. Create a more vibrant and nurturing Parish community

- increase the use of Social Media to advertise parish events

- increase the number of "Fellowship Sundays" after Sunday Mass to encourage parishioner socialization

- resume Mens' and Womens' Retreats, which were paused during the COVID-19 pandemic

3. Increase Parish Almsgiving

- add an Outreach Council bulletin board in the church vestibule to highlight current outreach activities and opportunities

- Embed outreach activities throughout the parish (e.g. PREP, other committees, etc.)

We hope you join us in embracing these goals and associated changes to help us make St. Hilary of Poitiers an even more welcoming and vibrant Parish Community!

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) at St. Hilary Parish

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which people who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith can attend weekly classes and have the opportunity to become members of the Catholic Church.

RCIA is for adults who:

- Are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith
- Have never been baptized
- Have been baptized in another Christian faith and are interested in the Catholic faith
- Are baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion & Confirmation
- Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass, and would like to take the next steps to become a member of the Catholic Church



RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning in October and ending with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. RCIA classes are taught by Father Murray and are held every Monday evening from 7:00-8:30pm at the rectory. These classes are for anyone with interest, no matter what your current denomination. ST. HILARY EAGLES BLOCK POOL

The pool will include the final 16 games of our PHILADELPHIA EAGLES season, and will raise funds for our parish.

1st game will be Week #2 on Thursday, 9/14/23 vs

Minnesota Vikings



Here is how it works:

Blocks will be sold for \$80.00 each
(\$5 per week, for 16 weeks).

The pool administrator will randomly place your names on the 1st week's grid, until the grid is full.

That grid will then be copied for all 16 weeks.

Your designated block stays the same all season.
At that time, numbers from 0 to 9 will be randomly chosen for each week, for both, the Eagles and their opponent. The numbers along the top and side will be different each week, so each block has the same chance of winning.

The completed blocks will be circulated through email and hard copies will be available before the opening game kickoff.

The score at the end of regulation (not overtime) will be used to decide each week's winner.

The unit digit from each team's score will be used as lookups to determine the winning participant.

For example, Eagles 41 versus New England PAT-SIES 33, we would use Eagles 1 and PATSIES 3 as the lookups. Each weekly winner will receive \$250 sent out by the pool's administrator.

We estimate that the Parish/CYO will pay out \$4,000 in prizes, and make \$4,000 to offset a variety of costs, for each grid of 100 blocks. Thank you!
