

"Christ became obedient to the point of death on a Cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name which is above every other name."


-- Philippians 2:8-9

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

This coming June, we will complete our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$427,176.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$350,536. Of the 231 families who have pledged, 169 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed, and all bills are now paid, thanks to you! I hope you enjoyed our new air conditioning system in the Church in summer. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we are in the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace & peace, Fr. Murray

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent, and on Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

THE BLACK DOT

One day, a professor entered the classroom and asked his students to prepare for a surprise test. They waited anxiously at their desks for the test to begin. The professor handed out the question paper, with the text facing down, as usual. Once he handed them all out, he asked his students to turn the page and begin. To everyone's surprise, there were no questions...just a black dot in the center of the page.

The professor, seeing the expression on everyone's faces, told them the following: "I want you to write what you see there." The confused students got started on the difficult task. At the end of the class, the professor took all the answer papers and started reading each of them aloud in front of all the students. All of them, with no exceptions, described the black dot, trying to explain its position in the middle of the sheet.

After all had been read, the classroom very silent, the professor began to explain: "I am not going to grade you on this. I just wanted to give you something to think about. No one wrote about the white part of the paper. Everyone focused on the black dot - and the same happens in our lives. We have a white paper to observe and enjoy, but we tend to always focus on the dark spots.

Our life is a gift given to us by God, with love and care, and we always have reasons to celebrate...our friends and family around us, nature renewing itself every day, the job that provides our livelihood, the miracles we see every day. 

Palm Sunday

What will you do with your palm?

The palm brought home today is to be used to remind you that Jesus is worthy of praise ~ today and always. Place the palm behind a crucifix or picture of Jesus in your home or perhaps in some other place where you will see it day after day and be reminded to cry out, "Hosanna to King Jesus!"



THREE DAYS OF WORSHIP

Holy Thursday celebrates the Mass of the Lord's Supper in the evening, commemorating the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. Christ's new commandment to love one another is recalled in the Washing the Feet. That love becomes fully realized in the Eucharist and Christ's sacrifice on Calvary.

On Good Friday, the Church gathers in silence to read Scripture and offer prayers for the whole world. The Veneration of the Cross takes place not simply to mourn Jesus' suffering and death but to acknowledge that through the cross of Jesus, we are led to glory.

The Easter Vigil is the high point of the entire Church liturgical year. The new fire is blessed and candles glow in the celebration of Christ as our light. Salvation history is proclaimed through Scriptures, climaxing in the joyous proclamation that Christ has risen. Those who have been prepared for baptism enter the Church, and all Catholics renew their baptismal promises, for this night commemorates our share in the dying and rising of Jesus.
