Deacon's Corner

"Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven" Matthew 5:3

Today we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, a day in which we remember all those people we deem as Saints or Holy People. I think it is safe to say that none of us think of ourselves as saints. When we think of saints we think of people who lived perfect lives filled with Holiness. Yet the truth of the matter is that saints in most cases were simple ordinary people who lived extraordinary lives. That extraordinary piece may not always have been present, many times it came later in their lives. The more you study the lives of saints you will realize that most of them aren't much different than you and I. What sets them apart is their ability to listen and follow the words of Christ. Holiness and Sanctity may seem so out of reach when we compare ourselves to the lives of saints. Yet, in recent years we have been very fortunate to actually know and witness the lives of some of our more modern day saints like, St. John Paul II, St. Teresa of Calcutta as well as our most recently Beatified Blessed Carlo Acutis. It is nothing more than living the Paschal Mystery, a daily dying to self so that we put others before us. This can be as simple as being a member of a family and having the opportunity to practice this everyday. Like when parents sacrifice their own wants for the sake of their children, or when siblings put the needs of their brothers or sisters before their own, These are acts of sanctity.

Our Church over the years has recognized certain people for their extraordinary lives and after much research they can attribute miracles attached to them because of their holiness. But that does not mean that there are not many more saints who are both living and deceased, who possess those same qualities. These are people who you and I have come across in our lives that have brought us closer to God. These are people who have helped us grow our relationship in order for us to one day join Him in His Heavenly Kingdom.

So let us all remember all those people who have helped us on our journey in life, both the ones our Church has brought before us as well as those who have touched us personally. May we ask them for their intercession to help is gain eternal life with Christ.

(3 May 1991 – 12 October 2006) He was an Italian <u>Catholic</u> schoolboy and amateur computer programmer.^[3] He was best known for documenting <u>Eucharistic miracles</u> around the world and cataloguing them all onto a <u>website</u> that he created in the months before his death from <u>leukemia</u>.^[3] He was noted for his cheerfulness and his computer skills as well as for his deep devotion to the <u>Eucharist</u>, which becomes a core theme of his life.^[4]



RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which people who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith can attend classes and have the opportunity to become members of the Catholic Church. R.C.I.A. is for adults who:

- 1. Are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith
- 2. Have never been baptized
- 3. Have been baptized in another Christian faith and are interested in the Catholic faith
- 4. Are Baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation
- 5. Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass and would
- like to take the next steps to become a member of the Catholic Church

RCIA is a spiritual formation process will begin after we interview our candidates and will end with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. RCIA classes are held every Monday evening form 7:00-8:30pm at the rectory. Classes are taught by Father Murray, Deacon John and other team members. Pope Francis & Civil Unions

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia's Office for Communications released the following statement on the evening of October 21, 2020, on comments made by Pope Francis in a documentary film, "Francesco." Details from the Catholic News Service: There has been much attention paid to comments attributed to the Holy Father in a documentary that premiered in Rome this past week. It is important to note that the remarks appeared in the context of a film, and not a church teaching.

Further references involved civil unions. The Holy Father has consistently affirmed the sacrament or marriage as a union between one man and one woman on many occasions, just as he has affirmed the need to treat all people with respect and dignity.

The recent comments underscore the Holy Father's previous calls for pastoral and cultural sensitivity to the many different journeys of those who walk through life around us.

If you have been married by a Justice of the Peace or in a Civil Marriage and wish to have your marriage blessed by the Church and be able to return to the sacraments, most especially, the Sacrament of the Eucharist, please call the rectory at 215-884-3252

DO YOU KNOW YOUR TRIBUNAL?

The Tribunal is available to help people who have experienced divorce and who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church.

When a divorce occurs, the Catholic Church always seeks to balance two realities. On one hand the durable bond of marriage. This is God's law. On the other hand, the Church is concerned about the spiritual welfare of the people involved. Even though a Catholic wedding was celebrated, perhaps there was some deficiency in the consent of the parties involved regarding intentions, understanding or ability? The annulment procedure addresses these circumstances.
