THE TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



October is dedicated to our Lady of the Rosary

It all started in 1571, when the Catholic League entered into battle against the Ottoman Empire to protect Italy from invasion. The Turks were on a warpath to overthrow all of Europe, killing millions of people and forcing Islamic conversion on survivors. They had conquered the Middle East and Mediterranean islands of Cyrus and Crete. Italy was next.

As the impending battle loomed, Pope Pius V called on various religious communities throughout Europe to join him in praying the rosary, including public recitations, to defeat the Islamic threat. Heading into battle, every man in the Catholic League's forces carried a rosary. Their fleet was no match for the competition, vastly outnumbered.

Miraculously, the Catholic League returned victorious after a daylong battle known as the Battle of Lepanto that took place off the coast of Greece. In thanksgiving for Mary's intercession and protection, Pope Pius V declared the day — October 7 — as a feast day for Our Lady of the Rosary. To celebrate, a rosary procession was held in Saint Peter's Square.

The presence and protection of our Mother Mary has immense power — requested, channeled, and honored through the rosary. Her immaculate intercession has won wars and conquered hearts. After the feast day was established, the entire month of October was dedicated to the rosary in 1884 by Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical Superiore Anno:

Deacon's Corner


"We are citizens of two worlds, with responsibility to both worlds."

Our gospel today contains a crucial message for every Christian. Jesus makes it clear that we all possess dual citizenship. We are citizens of two worlds: citizens of earth and citizens of heaven. And because of our dual citizenship, we have responsibilities toward both worlds: toward God and toward Caesar. These two obligations are like two sides if the same coin. A failure in our duty as citizens, literally, constitutes a failure in our duty as Christians. We have a grave responsibility to keep the administration of our nation from falling into the hands of selfish and unqualified leaders. Referring to this responsibility, Peter says to the Christians in his First Letter: "Have reverence for God and respect the Emperor."

This leads us to an important final consideration. What happens if our dual citizenship leads us into an open conflict between God and our country? We certainly hope that this will not happen. But if it does then we must resolve the conflict in such a way that we do not compromise our primary obligation to God. This is certainly not a situation that only happened back in Jesus' time, it is still going on today.

Here we are some two thousand years later, in the middle of a very controversial election. Each of us possessing that same dual citizenship, and with that dual citizenship we need to follow our conscience. And if conflicted, we need to resolve this in such a way that we do not compromise our primary obligation to God. At the same time we need to remain faithful to our beliefs as to what is right for God and our country.

- 4. Are Baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion or Confirmation
- 5. Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass and would like to take the next steps to become a member of the Catholic Church

RCIA is a spiritual formation process will begin after we interview our candidates and will end with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. RCIA classes are held every Monday evening form 7:00-8:30pm at the rectory. Classes are taught by Father Murray, Deacon John and other team members. (Catechism of the

DO YOU KNOW YOUR TRIBUNAL?

The Tribunal is available to help people who have experienced divorce and who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church.

When a divorce occurs, the Catholic Church always seeks to balance two realities. On one hand the durable bond of marriage. This is God's law. On the other hand, the Church is concerned about the spiritual welfare of the people involved. Even though a Catholic wedding was celebrated, perhaps there was some deficiency in the consent of the parties involved regarding intentions, understanding or ability? The annulment procedure addresses these circumstances.
