Each Labor Day, we reflect on the sacred dignity of work and those who perform it. *Rerum novarum* (1891): written by Pope Leo XIII, addressed the harsh conditions of the working class during the Industrial Revolution, rejecting both unbridled capitalism and revolutionary socialism while defending workers' rights and human dignity. Since that landmark encyclical (encyclicals are letters/teachings of the pope to offer moral clarity, spiritual direction, and teachings on faith, morals, or current world issues) many popes have issued similar teachings with the current socio-economic realities in mind. The recent encyclical by Pope Leo XIV builds on previous teachings with the most current "new thing" – Artificial Intelligence.

Pope Leo's 'Magnifica humanitas' (Magnificent Humanity) marked the 135th anniversary of *Rerum Novarum*. The encyclical is subtitled "On Safeguarding the Human Person in the Time of Artificial Intelligence." He appeals for the safeguarding of humanity, promotion of truth, dignity of work, social justice, and peace.

Ascension Press offered this brief summary of the encyclical:

Magnifica Humanitas acknowledges familiar concerns about AI, including job insecurity, manipulation of information, privacy violations, ideological bias, autonomous weapons, and a futuristic vision of an "enhanced human being." But Pope Leo XIV identifies a deeper danger: that human beings may begin to see themselves and others as projects "to be optimized" (Magnifica Humanitas 112).

Against this, the encyclical teaches that human limits such as illness, aging, suffering, and vulnerability are not simply defects to be corrected; rather, human beings often flourish through their limitations, where they can discover wisdom, experience the closeness of others, and encounter the Lord (MH 118–119). Therefore, AI should serve humanity not by tempting us to escape limitation through optimization, but by supporting a life of "openness and communion" (MH 231).

As we celebrate this Labor Day, let us turn in prayer to Saint Joseph the Worker, the humble carpenter who modeled dignity, diligence, and care through his daily labor and love of family. Through his intercession, may we protect the rights of all workers, advocate courageously for the vulnerable, and ensure that technological progress always honors the sacredness of human work.

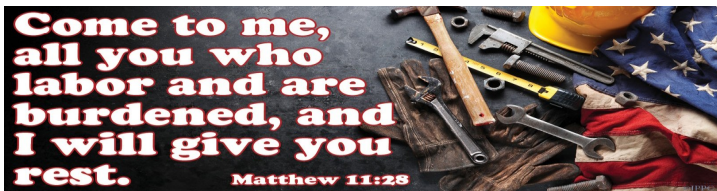

It is with a humble and grateful heart that I get to write this letter of introduction to the entire parish of St. Hilary Church. My name is Fr. Andrew Heiman. When I was ordained on May 28, 2005, as a priest for the diocese of Wichita, Kansas, I never thought that I would have the opportunity to serve in a seminary in Philadelphia and help at a parish in the Archdiocese. Yet, I should not be surprised that God continues to pour out His abundant blessings upon me as He has done throughout my life.

One great blessing has been my family. My mother and father are just amazing. With both having an education background, they have taught me many things, but most importantly how to grow in a deeper love for Christ and to dedicate my life to Him by showing their own love for Jesus. This past April 17th, my parents celebrated 55 years of marriage, being an example of committed sacrificial love and forgiveness both in the good times and difficult moments. Two years ago, much to my surprise, I was asked by the seminary of Saint Charles Borromeo to help on faculty as Director of Spiritual Formation for the college seminarians. I was honored by the request and my bishop gave the approval of my transfer from Wichita. God has given me the wonderful opportunity to help in different parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia as well. I now look forward to walking with all of you in our journey to Heaven, the path of becoming saints. Please pray for me and I will continue to pray for all of you.

ST. HILARY'S EAGLES FOOTBALL BLOCK POOL



The pool will include the final 16 games of our PHILADELPHIA EAGLES season, and will raise funds for our parish.

1st game will be Week #2 on
Sunday, 9/20/26 vs Tennessee Titans!



Here is how it works:

Blocks will be sold for \$80 each
(\$5 per week, for 16 weeks).



Semi-annual payment plan will be available.

The pool administrator will randomly place your names on the 1st week's grid, until the grid is full. That grid will then be copied for all 16 weeks.

Your designated block stays the same all season.

At that time, numbers from 0 to 9 will be randomly chosen for each week, for both, the Eagles and their opponent. The numbers along the top and side will be different each week, so each block has the same chance of winning. The completed blocks will be circulated through email, and hard copies will be available before the opening game kickoff.

The score at the end of regulation (not OT) will be used to decide each week's winner. The unit digit from each team's score will be used as lookups to determine the winning participant. For example, EAGLES 41 vs New England PATSIES 33, we would use Eagles 1 and PATSIES 3 as the lookups. Each weekly winner will receive \$250 sent out by the pool's administrator. We estimate that the parish will pay out \$4,000 in prizes, and make \$4,000 to offset a variety of costs, for each grid of 100 blocks.

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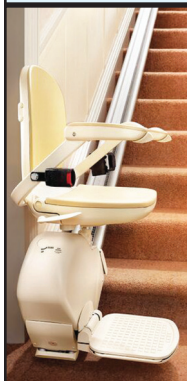
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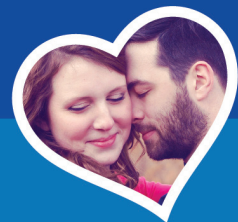
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
