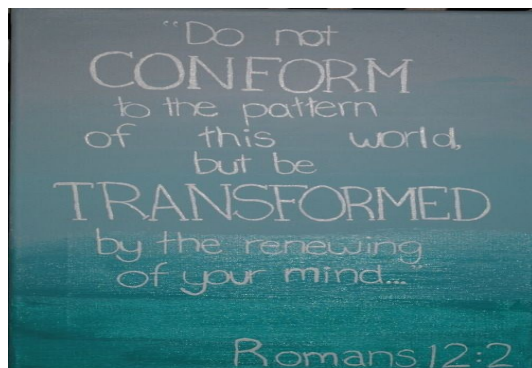
This weekend's Gospel continues the story that began last weekend. Last week, Simon Peter was called the "rock" upon which Jesus would build his Church, and yet Peter continues to show the limitations of his understanding of Jesus' identity. Now that the disciples have acknowledged that Jesus is the Messiah, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he must suffer and die in Jerusalem to be raised on the third day. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely, calling him "Satan." In opposing this aspect of Jesus' mission, Peter shows that he is no longer speaking based on the revelation from God but as a human being. Jesus then teaches all of the disciples about the difficult path of discipleship: to be Christ's disciple is to follow in his way of the cross.

Peter could not yet understand what it meant to call Jesus the Messiah. It is unlikely that the other disciples understood any better. Messianic expectations were a common aspect of first-century Judaism. Under Roman occupation, many in Israel hoped and prayed that God would send a Messiah to free the Jews from Roman oppression. The common view was that the Messiah would be a political figure, a king that would free Israel from Roman rule. This is perhaps what Peter envisioned when he was led to recognize Jesus as the Messiah. In this passage, however, Jesus is beginning to teach his disciples that he would be the Messiah in a different way.

Jesus would be more like the suffering servant described by the prophet Isaiah than the political liberator. Those who would be Jesus' disciples would be called to a similar life of service. Perhaps this is what Peter feared most in Jesus' prediction of his Passion. He whom Jesus had called "rock" would also be called upon to offer himself in sacrifice and service to others. Christian leaders today are still called to sacrifice and serve others as Jesus did. So are we all.

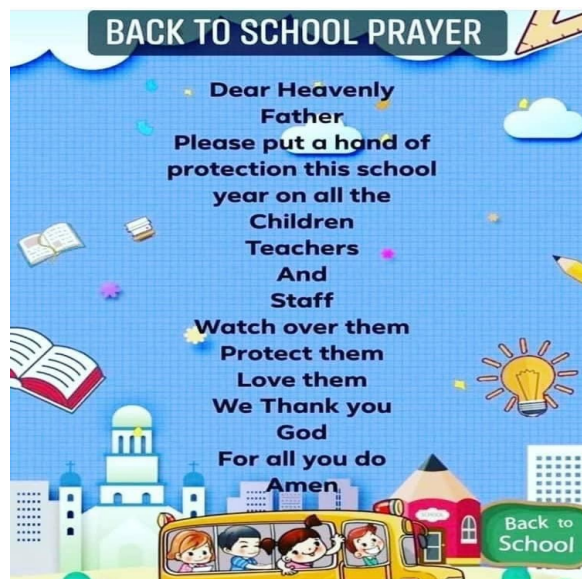

ANNUAL MISSION CO-OP

We will be visited this weekend by Rev. Chanlis Chacko who will speak to us about the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, India. The diocese is 11 years old and it tries to give the Gospel of Our Lord to the 45,000 faithful there, as well as the many inhabitants of the county. There are 107 priests in the diocese and some are retired due to their old age and some are studying abroad. They have 56 seminarians studying for the priesthood but their parents are not well off to support them, so it is the responsibility of the diocese to provide their basic needs during their formation of 12 years. Their primary concentration is in reviving and consolidating the spiritual renewal of the faithful through separate prayer groups for women, men, and youth. They give great priority in assisting the poorest of the poor as well as for autistic children, the mentally ill, and homeless. They are appreciative of our parish's prayers & support. The Mission Co-Op weekend is sponsored by the Pontifical Mission Societies, to help build up the Church in dioceses worldwide, where Christianity is new. **You can use your Mission Co-Op blue envelopes in your bi-monthly mailing or your own marked envelope (envelopes also available on the windowsills in Church. ST. HILARY'S EAGLES FOOTBALL BLOCK POOL



The pool will include the final 16 games of our PHILADELPHIA EAGLES season, and will raise funds for our parish.

**1st game will be Week #2 on
Sunday, 9/20/26 vs Tennessee Titans!**



Here is how it works:

Blocks will be sold for \$80 each
(\$5 per week, for 16 weeks).



Semi-annual payment plan will be available.

The pool administrator will randomly place your names on the 1st week's grid, until the grid is full. That grid will then be copied for all 16 weeks.

Your designated block stays the same all season.

At that time, numbers from 0 to 9 will be randomly chosen for each week, for both, the Eagles and their opponent. The numbers along the top and side will be different each week, so each block has the same chance of winning. The completed blocks will be circulated through email, and hard copies will be available before the opening game kickoff.

The score at the end of regulation (not OT) will be used to decide each week's winner. The unit digit from each team's score will be used as lookups to determine the winning participant. For example, EAGLES 41 vs New England PATSIES 33, we would use Eagles 1 and PATSIES 3 as the lookups. Each weekly winner will receive \$250 sent out by the pool's administrator. We estimate that the parish will pay out \$4,000 in prizes, and make \$4,000 to offset a variety of costs, for each grid of 100 blocks.

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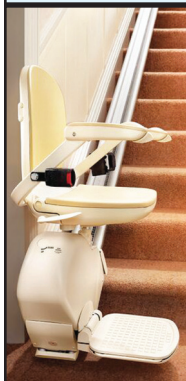
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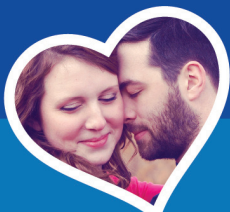
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
