PASTOR'S CORNER

"PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD"

- - Matthew 3:1-12

In our First Reading today, Isaiah laments that his world is falling apart. His once prosperous nation is in utter ruin. Yet he remains a person of hope that the majestic Israel, now a mere stump, will come to life again. A new king is coming to rule...not with weapons of war, but with mercy. It is God's mercy that will enable the "wolf to be a guest of the lamb, the calf and lion browse together, and that a little child will lead them."

Jesus Christ is the child of Isaiah's dream. Advent is now our call to follow the Lord's lead. Pope Francis reminds us that we must be willing to be lead; to come out of ourselves and to find the God of perpetual surprises. The wolf and the lamb, the calf and the lion, are within us all. They are present within our struggle between good and evil, and within the pride that wants our will to be done, not God's.

The little child comes to us today humbly in the Eucharist. May we derive hope from His lessons of mercy and prepare a way for Him to enter our minds and hearts. His presence within will be a source of unending hope, no matter the situation. This is the season "to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day."

SAINTS OF ADVENT

Many of us find ourselves running frantically from one event to another in Advent. Blessed Nicolas Steno (1638-86) could not focus. He wanted nothing more than to focus on the study of medicine, but he kept getting distracted. It drove him nuts, to the point that he wrote, "I pray thee, oh God, take this plaque from me and free my soul of all distraction and to work on medicine alone." And God said no. He could have taken away Steno's ADHD (though of course he lived long before such a diagnosis would have been made) but if God had answered Steno's prayer, Steno would never have essentially invented geology or laid the groundwork for paleontology. And he wouldn't have become Catholic. He wouldn't have become a priest and a bishop, and he wouldn't have been beatified. He was willing to trust God in the midst of all the distractions of his complicated life. This Advent, it's important to honor the actual life you have, and to praise God in the midst of the distractions and seek Him in the frantic times. On the feast of Blessed Nicolas Steno on Dec. 5, take time to ask God to guide your overall life and to make His love known in the midst of it all.

In 1965, Charles Schulz, a devout Christian and creator of the Peanuts comic strip, was asked to create a Christmas special for CBS featuring the Peanuts characters. He agreed, with one requirement...that they allow him to include the story of the birth of Jesus. Although the station's executives were hesitant and tried to convince him otherwise, Schulz was insistent. As a result, for the past 50 plus years, millions of people have watched "A Charlie Brown Christmas" and heard the story of Jesus and "what Christmas is all about."

Linus, a child who seems to have some insecurities, carries a security blanket with him at all times. Linus never drops his blanket, except while sharing the message of "what Christmas is all about." He drops it at the exact moment he says the words, "Fear not!" In this seemingly innocent moment, Linus delivers a powerful reminder of the true meaning of Christmas. We are to "fear not," for Jesus is born. We needn't rely on material things for security; we have God with us, "Immanuel" (Matthew 1:23), Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior - the true meaning of Christmas.

Linus picks up his blanket at the end of his speech. However, he "drops" it again later. Amid big, bright, colorful, shiny artificial trees, Charlie Brown chose the least of these...a little, wooden tree with just a few branches. Shortly thereafter, Linus uses his blanket to wrap about the base of the tree and says, "Maybe it just needs a little love." In that moment, the tree "awakens," stands tall and firm, and we are reminded that no matter who we are, how many mistakes we've made, a "little love" can make all the difference.



Let's strive to "fear not" (Luke 2:10) and "love one another" (John 13:34) ~ not just at Christmastime, but the whole year through.
