

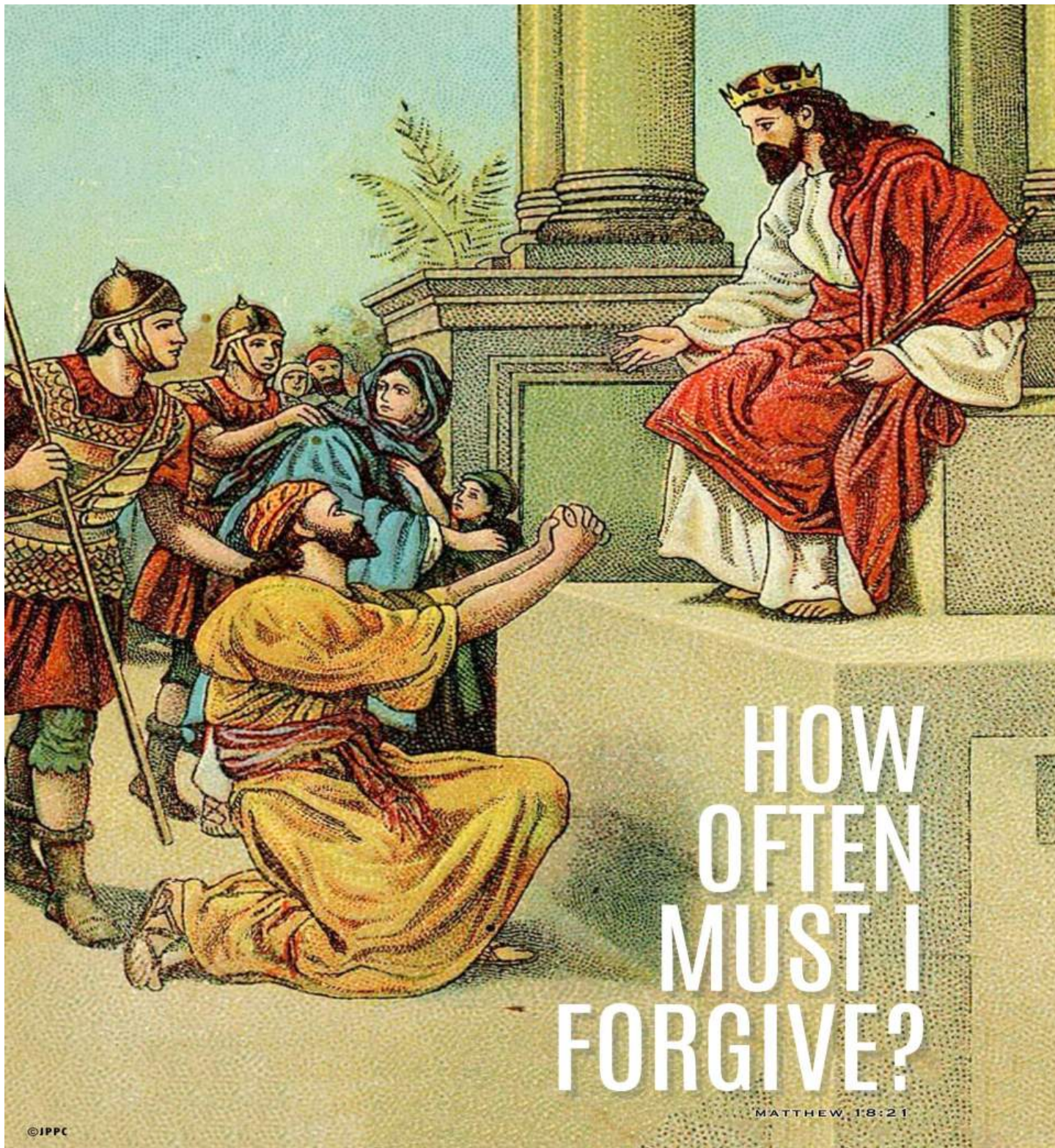

PASTOR'S CORNER

"How often must I forgive?"

-- Matthew 18:25

Imagine if all of your debts were cancelled... your mortgage, college debt, car loans, etc. What a gift that would be! How would you react? Would it make you more generous and compassionate? These are the questions the gospel today is asking us. There are two surprising endings here. One - the debt of the steward was cancelled outright. No payment plan was set up or no discussions on when you could pay. Two - in the face of such extraordinary mercy, the steward would not forgive a fellow steward who owed him a mere fraction of debt. The master's gesture awakened in him no sense of gratitude or compassion for another person.

There are people in our lives for whom we owe so much gratitude...parents, co-workers, other family members, and friends who have always been there for us. We owe them a huge amount of debt. Above all else, think of what we owe God. St. Paul tells us, "God cancelled our debt and nailed it to the cross." Some debts can never be repaid, but they can be passed on to others. This is all God asked of the steward: "I cancelled your debt; could you not have shown mercy to others as I showed you?"

As the Book of Sirach reminds us, "How can we nourish anger and expect healing to be pardoned and refuse to be merciful?" We pray, ever mindful of God's great mercy, that we may learn the lesson of mercy. May we show our gratitude by extending that mercy even more generously and creatively to others.

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$421,276.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$319,221.50. Of the 230 families who have pledged, 161 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you are enjoying our new air conditioning system in the Church. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we enter the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.

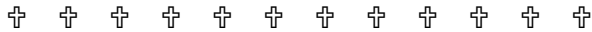

In this year of reviving our devotion to the Eucharist and encouraging everyone to return to Mass, we will offer weekly meditations, reflections, and poetry from various saints and authors on the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, which is "the source and summit of the Christian life." Excerpts are taken from the book The Holy Hour, a Word on Fire publication.

Reflection by Bishop Robert Barron: "**Catholicism**"

At the very beginning of her career, Flannery O'Connor, who would develop into one of the greatest Catholic writers of fiction in the 20th century, sat down to dinner with Mary McCarthy and a group of other New York intellectuals. The young Flannery, clearly the junior member of this sophisticated circle, was overwhelmed and barely said a word all evening. McCarthy, a former Catholic, trying to draw O'Connor out, made a few nice remarks about the Eucharist, commenting that it was a very powerful symbol. Flannery looked up and in a shaky voice said, "Well, if it's a symbol, to hell with it." I can't imagine a better summary of the Catholic doctrine of the Real Presence.

PARISH SYNODAL SURVEY

During Lent 2023, St. Hilary Parish participated in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's Synodal Process by executing a parish-wide survey, called the Disciple Maker Index. Thanks to everyone who participated in the survey. The Parish Council & Father Murray reviewed the results, and after much reflection, developed three goals to address some of the areas of improvement identified in the survey. The three goals, as well as planned actions, are as follows:

1. Increase Family Participation in the Mass

- starting in September, we will begin adjusting the homily of the 10am Mass to gear more toward families & kids

- we recently installed a small bookshelf with religious books in the vestibule for young children; we invite the parents with small children to "borrow" a book from this bookshelf during Mass

- we will also be investigating purchasing children's Mass missalettes to add to our pews sometime in late 2023 or early 2024

2. Create a more vibrant and nurturing Parish community

- increase the use of Social Media to advertise parish events

- increase the number of "Fellowship Sundays" after Sunday Mass to encourage parishioner socialization

- resume Mens' and Womens' Retreats, which were paused during the COVID-19 pandemic

3. Increase Parish Almsgiving

- add an Outreach Council bulletin board in the church vestibule to highlight current outreach activities and opportunities

- Embed outreach activities throughout the parish (e.g. PREP, other committees, etc.)

We hope you join us in embracing these goals and associated changes to help us make St. Hilary of Poitiers an even more welcoming and vibrant Parish Community!

SEVEN VIRTUES FOR SUCCESSFUL CATHOLICS

Practicing virtues - habitual & firm dispositions to do good - leads to long-lasting interior freedom, joy, and peace. The following seven virtues, with god's grace, can help you do that:

- * **Faith...**enables our belief in God and all that He has revealed through Scripture, Tradition, and the teachings of the Church; reciting the Creed at Mass is an act of faith
- * **Hope...**is the desire for heaven and trust in God's promises to us; trusting in the Lord, even in trials and asking for forgiveness, are acts of hope
- * **Charity...**enables us to love God above all things and our neighbors as ourselves; true love is when we wish and act for the authentic good of others
- * **Prudence...**is the virtue that helps us to discern our true good in every circumstance and to choose the right means of achieving it
- * **Justice...**helps us respect others' rights and give to each his due; we are made in His image so we owe each other respect
- * **Fortitude...**strengthens us to follow Christ in the world, even if it is unpopular and uncomfortable
- * **Temperance...**properly orders our desire for pleasure, so that we appreciate earthly goods in moderation and value heavenly good most; observing the one-hour fast from food before receiving the Eucharist is an act of temperance

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) at St. Hilary Parish

RCIA, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process by which people who are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith can attend weekly classes and have the opportunity to become members of the Catholic Church.

RCIA is for adults who:

- Are interested in learning about the Catholic Faith
- Have never been baptized
- Have been baptized in another Christian faith and are interested in the Catholic faith
- Are baptized Catholics who have not yet received the Sacraments of First Communion & Confirmation
- Are married to a Catholic and attend Mass, and would like to take the next steps to become a member of the Catholic Church



RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning in October and ending with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. RCIA classes are taught by Father Murray and are held every Monday evening from 7:00-8:30pm at the rectory. These classes are for anyone with interest, no matter what your current denomination.
