PASTOR'S CORNER

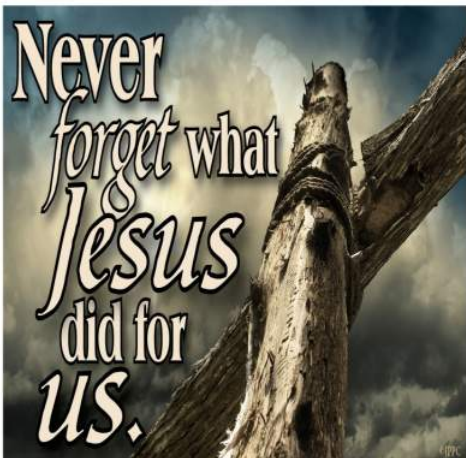
"He humbled Himself...to a point of death, even death on a cross."

Philippians 2:6-11

The Passion of the Lord proclaimed this Palm Sunday comprises two important points. The first is the event - Christ suffered and died, giving over His body and shedding his blood. The second is the motivation - this can be found in just two words... "for you!"

If we forget the why and the motivation, then Jesus' Passion is just a historical fact, disconnected from our personal lives. As one author put it, "The Passion of remains foreign, unless we enter the narrow door of the "for you." Yes, you and I are the reason this event took place. How do we respond? We respond by faith, and living the life which Jesus died to give us. Respond by showing gratitude, especially by being present with the Lord these coming Holy Days. Let us make a greater effort to fill this house - not just next week on Easter Sunday. Fill this house with great affection, with the fragrance of gratitude, and with the gift of love.

Pope Benedict once wrote: "There is no greater priority than to enable people of our time once more to encounter God." May this be our top priority this week to be with the Lord... by our silence, prayerfulness, and then most especially by our presence with Him who loved us and gave His life for us!

FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent, and on Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

Dear Parishioners,

I have long wrestled with how best to make this announcement. I find it easier for me to communicate it with this letter. As you may know, the retirement age for priests in the Archdiocese is 75. This coming spring, I will be turning 75 years old! It is hard for me to imagine that I have reached this milestone...I even checked my birth certificate to be sure - and so it is! With this in mind, and with mixed emotions, I wish to inform you that I will be retiring as your pastor this coming June.

I can't begin to express my heartfelt gratitude for your support over these many years. Your good faith, your loyalty in good times and in bad, and the many ways you have generously shared your time, talent, and treasure have been sources of many graces.

Your good will and care for our parish have enabled us to accomplish many needed projects for our church and school. How blessed I have been with an incredible support group! The Rectory and School Staffs and my brother priests, as well as our Parish Organizations, have enabled me to carry out my responsibilities as Pastor and have eased the challenges and burdens of administration.

What an absolutely wonderful gift to be a priest, and to celebrate Mass, preach the Gospel, and administer the sacraments to our youth and elderly and everyone in between. Thank you for allowing me to walk with you in the ways of faith in these many years. You will long be remembered in my thoughts and prayers, as well as at Masses. Please say a prayer for me as I embrace this new phase of priestly life. In closing, I pray God's grace and peace be with you and your loved ones.

Growing Together in Faith: Our DMI Survey Journey

In 2022 and 2025, our parish participated in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey, a tool provided by the Catholic Leadership Institute to help us understand our strengths and opportunities for growth. Your honest feedback has truly provided a clear roadmap for our future.

We are excited to share these key highlights comparing our 2022 and 2025 results:

A Younger, Growing Parish: We are welcoming many new faces! In 2025, 16% of respondents had been members for fewer than 5 years, compared to 9% in 2022.

Empowered Leadership: Our community is more engaged than ever. 79% of you now feel you have opportunities to serve the parish, up from 67% in 2022.

A Deeper Sunday Experience: The Eucharist remains our heart. 63% of respondents in 2025 reported growing spiritually from attending Mass, an increase from 59% in 2022.

Stronger Spiritual Practices: Our personal prayer lives are flourishing. 71% of parishioners now pray daily, up from 64% in 2022.

A Rising Missionary Impulse: We are sharing our faith! 64% of you invited someone to a parish activity this past year, a significant jump from 48% in 2022.

Those who have been prepared for baptism enter the Church and all Catholics renew their baptismal promises.
