PASTOR'S CORNER

"Rejoice always in the Lord."

This third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as "Gaudete Sunday." It is a call to rejoice. The word rejoice appears over and over again in our Scripture readings today. In the Gospel, people are looking for something or someone to rejoice in. However, in light of the evil unleashed in places like in our cities, joy is certainly a distant emotion. Random acts of violence preyed on innocent victims. Evil is very much alive and lashes out no matter who is in its path.

We pray to God "to deliver us from every evil." God has answered that prayer in the birth of Jesus Christ. Jesus was a victim of evil's fury, yet in His Resurrection, He gave evil a death blow. In the end, good will always triumphs. Evil may have its day but God will have the final say and final judgment. "God is in our midst," Isaiah tells us, and he, too, sheds tears for all innocent victims. What are we to do, the gospel questions today. The best thing we can do is draw closer to the Lord. Allow His plan to develop in our lives. Allow random acts of kindness to unfold in all areas of our lives. Don't allow any type of evil get a foothold in our lives. Allow room and space for reconciliation with family and friends. As St. Paul says, "Let your kindness be known to all."

Advent is a joy-filled time to reflect again on the words of Pope Benedict, "Let us all develop a heart that sees, where love is needed, and to act accordingly."

**STATEMENT OF ARCHBISHOP NELSON PÉREZ
REGARDING THE CANONIZATION OF BLESSED
CARLO ACUTIS AND BLESSED PIER GIORGIO
FRASSATI IN 2025**

My heart was filled with great joy to learn that Pope Francis will canonize Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as saints next year! This news ushers in great celebration for the Universal Church and especially for young Catholics. Blessed Carlo will be the first saint from the Millennial Generation and Blessed Pier Giorgio is a model of Missionary Discipleship for young adults leading busy lives while searching for true fulfillment.

Blessed Carlo, who died in 2016 at age 15, is an inspiration for children and adolescents through his passion for using technology to evangelize and share his devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. Blessed Pier Giorgio, who died in 1925 at age 24, is a model for young adults through his dedication to serving the poor in urban areas while balancing university studies, social activism, and daily prayer.

Both of these saintly young men reflect the call for today's youth and young adults to live out their Catholic faith with courage, compassion, and divine love. Blessed Carlo, in particular, holds a special place in the heart of our local Church. We were blessed to host his mother, Antonia Salvano Acutis last fall when she spoke about her son's love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist at our Eucharistic Congress. Her reflections filled us with wonder and awe. They still resonate as we strive to follow in the footsteps of her son.

I pray that the inspiration flowing from Blessed Carlo and Blessed Pier Giorgio will fuel the zealous hearts of our young people to serve others with Christ as their model. All Catholics should rejoice, as I do, in the canonization of saints for our time and for those who will inherit the Church on earth. Blessed Carlo and Blessed Pier Giorgio pray for us!

Be it done unto me according to your Word.





THE LEGEND OF THE CANDY CANE



The **hard candy** reminds us that *Jesus is our rock.* (Psalm 61:2)

The **cane shape** reminds us of a *shepherd's staff* and the shepherd that came to worship Jesus. It also reminds us of how Jesus came into the world to be a shepherd of his people. (Luke 2:8-15 and John 10:11)

The upside-down candy cane forms the letter "J" and reminds us of the name of *Jesus* which means "God saves." (Matthew 1:21)

The **peppermint flavor** reminds us of the *gift of spices* from the Wise Men. (Matthew 2:11)

The **white candy** reminds us of *purity and holiness*. It recalls the virgin birth of Christ, the sinless life of Christ and the holy life that Jesus wants his people to live. (Matthew 1:23 and 1 Peter 1:15)

The **color red** reminds us that *Jesus became a real flesh and blood man* and spilled his blood to save his people. (Hebrews 2:14)

The **stripes** remind us of the *lashes Jesus received* when he suffered for us and ultimately bore our sins that we might be healed. (1 Peter 2:24-25)

Please take a moment to read this quote of Pope Francis. It's fitting for believers & non-believers alike.

"You can have flaws, be anxious and even be angry, but do not forget that your life is the greatest enterprise in the world. Only you can stop it from failing. You are appreciated, admired, and loved by so many. Remember that being happy is not having a sky without a storm, a road without accidents, a job without effort, a relationship without disappointments. To be happy is to stop feeling like a victim and become the author of your own fate. It's walking through deserts, but being able to find an oasis deep in the soul. It is thanking God every morning for the miracle of life. It's kissing your children, cuddling your parents, having poetic moments with your friends, even when they hurt us. Being happy is letting the creature that lives in each of us live free, joyful and simple. You have the maturity to be able to say, 'I've made mistakes' and it's having the courage to say you're sorry. It's having the sense to say, 'I need you' and having the ability to say, 'I love you'. May your life become a garden of opportunities for happiness. And when you make a mistake, start over. Because only then will you be in love with life. You'll discover that being happy isn't having a perfect life. But use tears to irrigate tolerance. Use your defeats to train your patience. Above all, never give up on the people that love you. Never give up on being happy, because life is an incredible spectacle."


