PASTOR'S CORNER

"I am doing something new."
Isiah 43

St. Paul tells us of the "supreme good of knowing Jesus Christ as Lord." The woman in the Gospel today discovers that truth. She has been accused of adultery. Her accusers are ready to stone her to death. They want Jesus to decide her fate. It is a trap, for if Jesus says to let her go, He would be breaking the law of Moses, which said that adultery is punishable by stoning. If He says to stone her, He would be breaking Roman Law which said that only Roman officials can carry out the death penalty. Jesus responds by saying to stone her, if those who are accusing her are free from sin. One by one, the stones of hate are dropped and the accusers walk away. Then only two remain; Jesus and the woman. As St. Augustine describes, "misery and mercy" remain. The misery of the woman is swallowed up by Christ's mercy. And then at that moment, the woman knew the supreme good of knowing Jesus Christ.

Lent is our time to experience Christ's amazing grace. Every sinner has a future; every saint has a past. No matter our past, Jesus comes to free us from the misery of our sin and guilt. In the sacrament of Penance, we meet His mercy and hear those freeing words, "Go and sin no more." Then we can say with St. Paul, "I consider everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord."

Missionary Hubs in the Archdiocese

On January 5, 2025, Arch. Perez released a pastoral letter regarding the future of the Church of Philadelphia. In it, he discussed 2 primary challenges facing the church today - the first problem is many of our fellow Catholics have drifted away from the church and do not regularly attend Mass. In fact, 83% of baptized Catholics don't come to church. The second problem is that there continues to be a shortage of priests across the Archdiocese. In his letter, he reiterates that he did not become the Archbishop to close parishes; he came here to "build up the Church of Philadelphia." In an attempt to reverse the trend and build up the church, he announced the creation of Missionary Hubs across the diocese. A hub is an initiative planted in a local community, most likely within an existing parish setting. It will be focused on missionary outreach for a region within a county and serve a group of existing parishes. It will include various Catholic ministries and invite people into a relationship with Jesus Christ. A hub is designed to help our parish communities focus on the 83% of those who don't come through the church doors. Missionary Hubs are not intended to replace existing parishes. Rather, they are designed to enrich, supplement, and actively support parish life. Hubs are meant to work alongside and in collaboration with existing parishes. In cases where there are not sufficient priests to assign to each parish, parishes served by the Missionary Hub may be led by a Parish Life Director instead of a priest. The Archdiocese has created a website with more info and videos about this change, which the Archbishop plans to roll out in phases over the next decade. You can access the website at trustandhope.org.

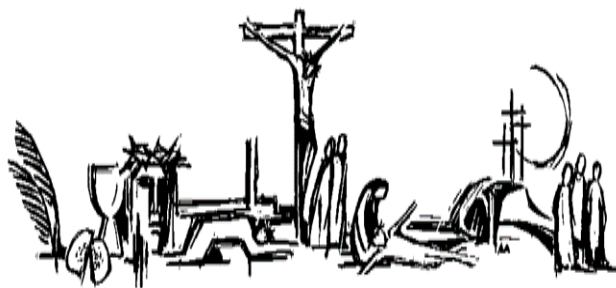
