

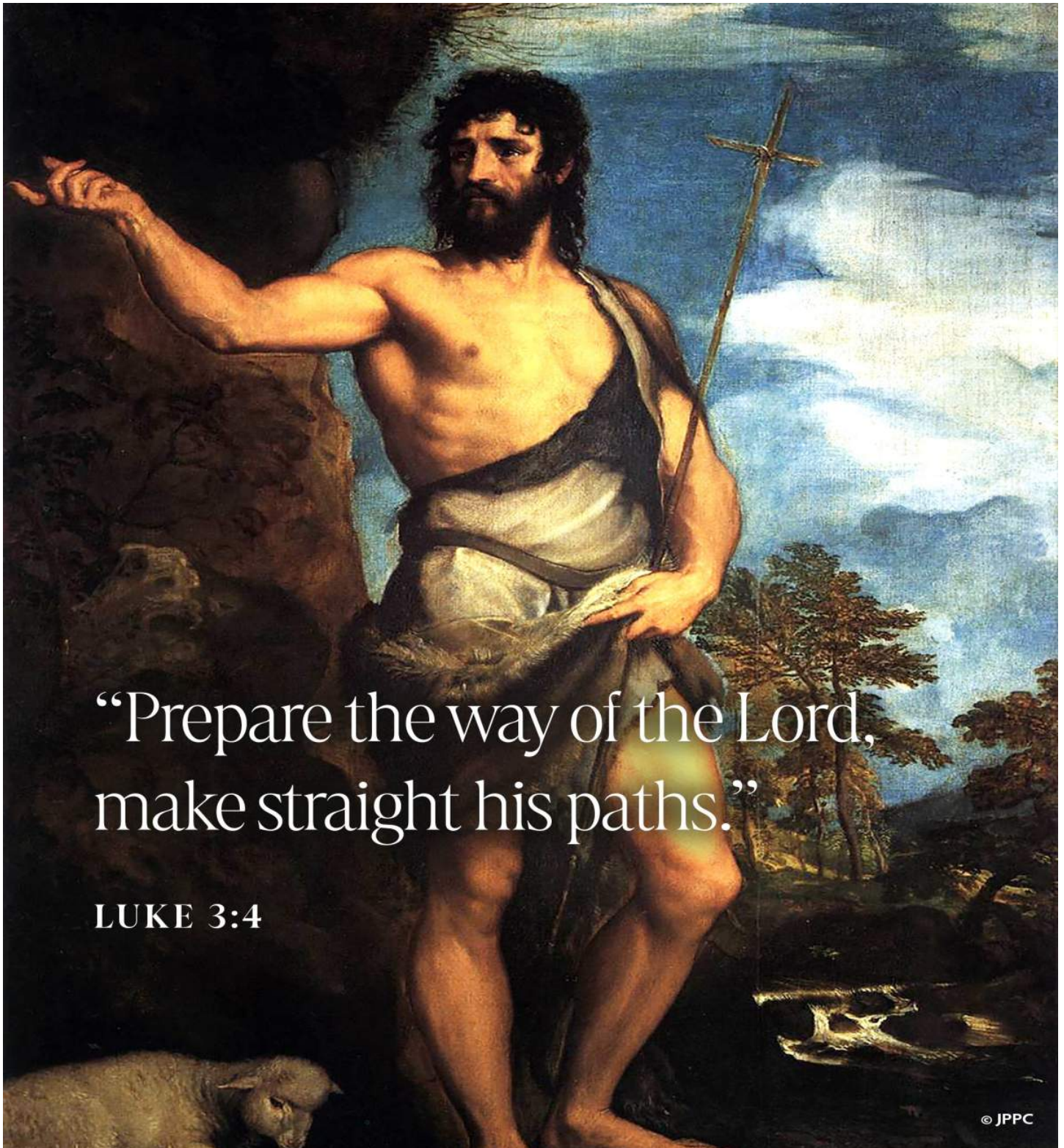

LUKE 3:4

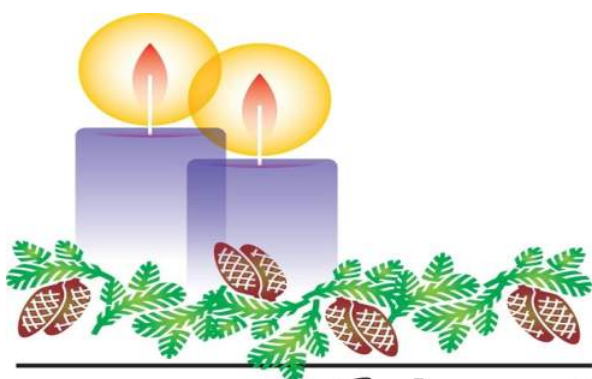
PASTOR'S CORNER

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STATEMENT OF ARCHBISHOP NELSON PÉREZ REGARDING THE CANONIZATION OF BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS AND BLESSED PIER GIORGIO FRASSATI IN 2025

My heart was filled with great joy to learn that Pope Francis will canonize Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati as saints next year! This news ushers in great celebration for the Universal Church and especially for young Catholics. Blessed Carlo will be the first saint from the Millennial Generation and Blessed Pier Giorgio is a model of Missionary Discipleship for young adults leading busy lives while searching for true fulfillment.

Blessed Carlo, who died in 2016 at age 15, is an inspiration for children and adolescents through his passion for using technology to evangelize and share his devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. Blessed Pier Giorgio, who died in 1925 at age 24, is a model for young adults through his dedication to serving the poor in urban areas while balancing university studies, social activism, and daily prayer.

Both of these saintly young men reflect the call for today's youth and young adults to live out their Catholic faith with courage, compassion, and divine love. Blessed Carlo, in particular, holds a special place in the heart of our local Church. We were blessed to host his mother, Antonia Salvano Acutis last fall when she spoke about her son's love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist at our Eucharistic Congress. Her reflections filled us with wonder and awe. They still resonate as we strive to follow in the footsteps of her son.

I pray that the inspiration flowing from Blessed Carlo and Blessed Pier Giorgio will fuel the zealous hearts of our young people to serve others with Christ as their model. All Catholics should rejoice, as I do, in the canonization of saints for our time and for those who will inherit the Church on earth. Blessed Carlo and Blessed Pier Giorgio pray for us!

In 1965, Charles Schulz, a devout Christian and creator of the Peanuts comic strip, was asked to create a Christmas special for CBS featuring the Peanuts characters. He agreed, with one requirement...that they allow him to include the story of the birth of Jesus. Although the station's executives were hesitant and tried to convince him otherwise, Schulz was insistent. As a result, for the past 50 plus years, millions of people have watched "A Charlie Brown Christmas" and heard the story of Jesus and "what Christmas is all about."

Linus, a child who seems to have some insecurities, carries a security blanket with him at all times. Linus never drops his blanket, except while sharing the message of "what Christmas is all about." He drops it at the exact moment he says the words, "Fear not!" In this seemingly innocent moment, Linus delivers a powerful reminder of the true meaning of Christmas. We are to "fear not," for Jesus is born. We needn't rely on material things for security; we have God with us, "Immanuel" (Matthew 1:23), Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior - the true meaning of Christmas.

Linus picks up his blanket at the end of his speech. However, he "drops" it again later. Amid big, bright, shiny artificial trees, Charlie Brown chose the least of these...a little, wooden tree with just a few branches. Shortly thereafter, Linus uses his blanket to wrap about the base of the tree and says, "Maybe it just needs a little love." In that moment, the tree "awakens," stands tall and firm, and we are reminded that no matter who we are, how many mistakes we've made, a "little love" can make all the difference.



Let's strive to "fear not" (Luke 2:10) and "love one another" (John 13:34) ~ not just at Christmastime, but the whole year through.

Some reflections for this 2nd Week of Advent in preparing for the Lord:

Sunday ~ Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1:38)

Monday ~ And the Word became flesh, and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. (John 1:14)

Tuesday ~ For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (John 3:16)

Wednesday ~ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see - I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people." (Luke 2:10)

Thursday ~ "I am truly your merciful Mother, yours and all the people who live united in this land and of all the other people of different ancestries." (Our Lady of Guadalupe)

Friday ~ "May we be in this world a ray of that light which shone forth from Bethlehem." (Pope Francis)

Saturday ~ See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. (Malachi 3:1)

Please take a moment to read this quote of Pope Francis. It's fitting for believers & non-believers alike.

"You can have flaws, be anxious and even be angry, but do not forget that your life is the greatest enterprise in the world. Only you can stop it from failing. You are appreciated, admired, and loved by so many. Remember that being happy is not having a sky without a storm, a road without accidents, a job without effort, a relationship without disappointments. To be happy is to stop feeling like a victim and become the author of your own fate. It's walking through deserts, but being able to find an oasis deep in the soul. It is thanking God every morning for the miracle of life. It's kissing your children, cuddling your parents, having poetic moments with your friends, even when they hurt us. Being happy is letting the creature that lives in each of us live free, joyful and simple. You have the maturity to be able to say, 'I've made mistakes and it's having the courage to say you're sorry. It's having the sense to say, 'I need you' and having the ability to say, 'I love you'. May your life become a garden of opportunities for happiness. And when you make a mistake, start over. Because only then will you be in love with life. You'll discover that being happy isn't having a perfect life. But use tears to irrigate tolerance. Use your defeats to train your patience. Above all, never give up on the people that love you. Never give up on being happy, because life is an incredible spectacle."

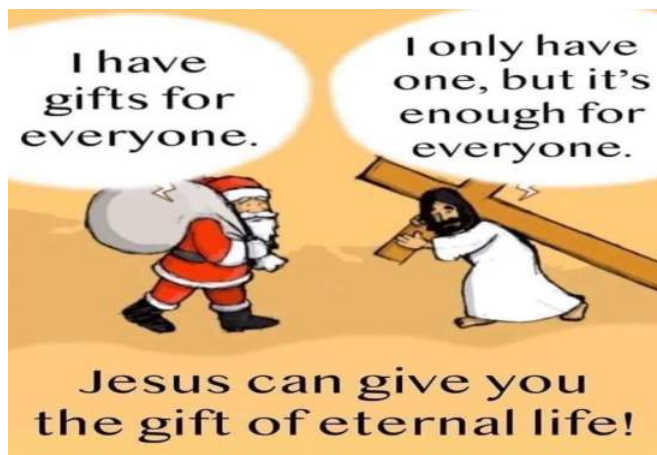

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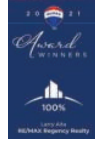
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
