

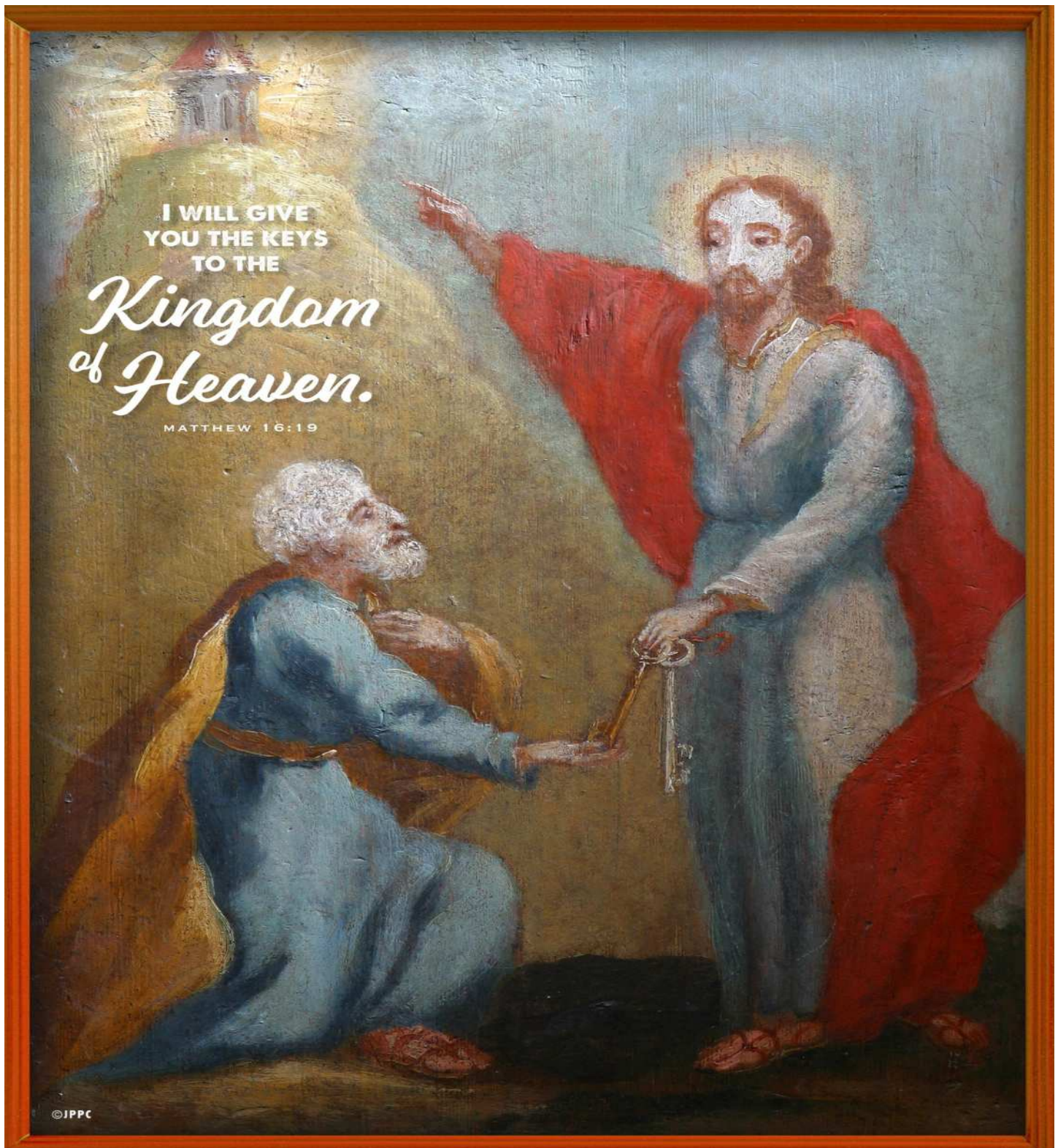

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



It is important to read this weekend and next weekend's Gospel as two parts of a single story. This week we hear Jesus name Simon Peter as the rock upon which he will build his Church. Next week we will hear Jesus call this same Simon Peter "Satan" when he reacts negatively to Jesus' prediction about his passion and death.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about his identity. The disciples indicate that most people believe that Jesus is a prophet of Israel. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they believe that he is. Simon Peter answers, identifying Jesus as the Messiah, the Son of God.

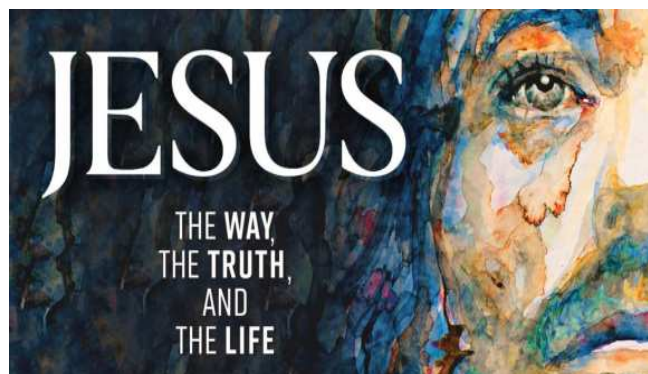
Jesus commends Simon Peter for this profession of faith, indicating that this insight has come from God. Because of Simon Peter's response, Jesus calls him the "rock" upon which Jesus will build the Church. This is a word play on the name Peter, which is the Greek word for "rock." Peter is then given special authority by Jesus, a symbolic key to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter will play an important role in the early Christian community as the first pope.

In today's Gospel, Peter's recognition of Jesus' identity is credited to a revelation by God. This will contrast sharply with Jesus' rebuke of Peter in next week's Gospel. When Peter rejects Jesus' prediction of his passion and death, Peter is said to no longer be thinking as God does but as humans do.

The use of the term *church* in today's Gospel is one of only three such occurrences in Matthew's Gospel. Peter in this Gospel is being credited as the foundation for the Church, a privilege granted to him because of his recognition of Jesus' identity. The Church continues to be grounded in the faith that Jesus Christ is Lord.

It is with a humble and grateful heart that I get to write this letter of introduction to the entire parish of St. Hilary Church. My name is Fr. Andrew Heiman. When I was ordained on May 28, 2005, as a priest for the diocese of Wichita, Kansas, I never thought that I would have the opportunity to serve in a seminary in the city of Philadelphia and help at a parish in the Archdiocese. Yet, I should not be surprised that God continues to pour out His abundant blessings upon me as He has done throughout my life.

One great blessing has been my family. My mother and father are just amazing. With both having an education background, they have taught me many things, but most importantly how to grow in a deeper love for Christ and to dedicate my life to Him by showing their own love for Jesus. This past April 17th, my parents celebrated 55 years of marriage, being an example of committed sacrificial love and forgiveness both in the good times and difficult moments. As for siblings, I have three living brothers and one deceased brother. Two years ago, much to my surprise, I was asked by the seminary of Saint Charles Borromeo to help on faculty as Director of Spiritual Formation for the college seminarians. I was honored by the request and my bishop gave the approval of my transfer from Wichita. God has given me the wonderful opportunity to help in different parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia as well. I now look forward to walking with all of you in our journey to Heaven, the path of becoming saints. Please pray for me and I will continue to pray for all of you.

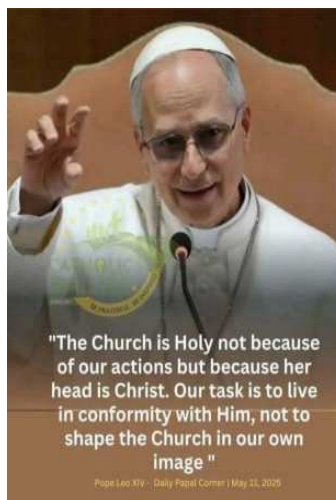

ANNUAL MISSION CO-OP

Nest Weekend ~
August 29th/30th

We will be visited by Rev. Chanlis Chacko who will speak to us about the Diocese of Pathanamthitta, India. The diocese is 11 years old and it tries to give the Gospel of Our Lord to the 45,000 faithful there, as well as the many inhabitants of the county. There are 107 priests in the diocese and some are retired due to their old age and some are studying abroad. Currently there are 65 priests in active ministry in mission churches and different institutions. They have 56 seminarians studying for the priesthood but their parents are not well off to support them, so it is the responsibility of the diocese to provide their basic needs during their formation of 12 years. Their primary concentration is in reviving and consolidating the spiritual renewal of the faithful through separate prayer groups for women, men, and youth. They give great priority in assisting the poorest of the poor as well as for autistic children, the mentally ill, and homeless. They are appreciative of our parish's prayers & support. The Mission Co-Op weekend is sponsored by the Pontifical Mission Societies, to help build up the Church in dioceses worldwide, where Christianity is new. **You can use your Mission Co-Op blue envelopes in your bi-monthly mailing or your own marked envelope (envelopes also available on the windowsills in Church.
