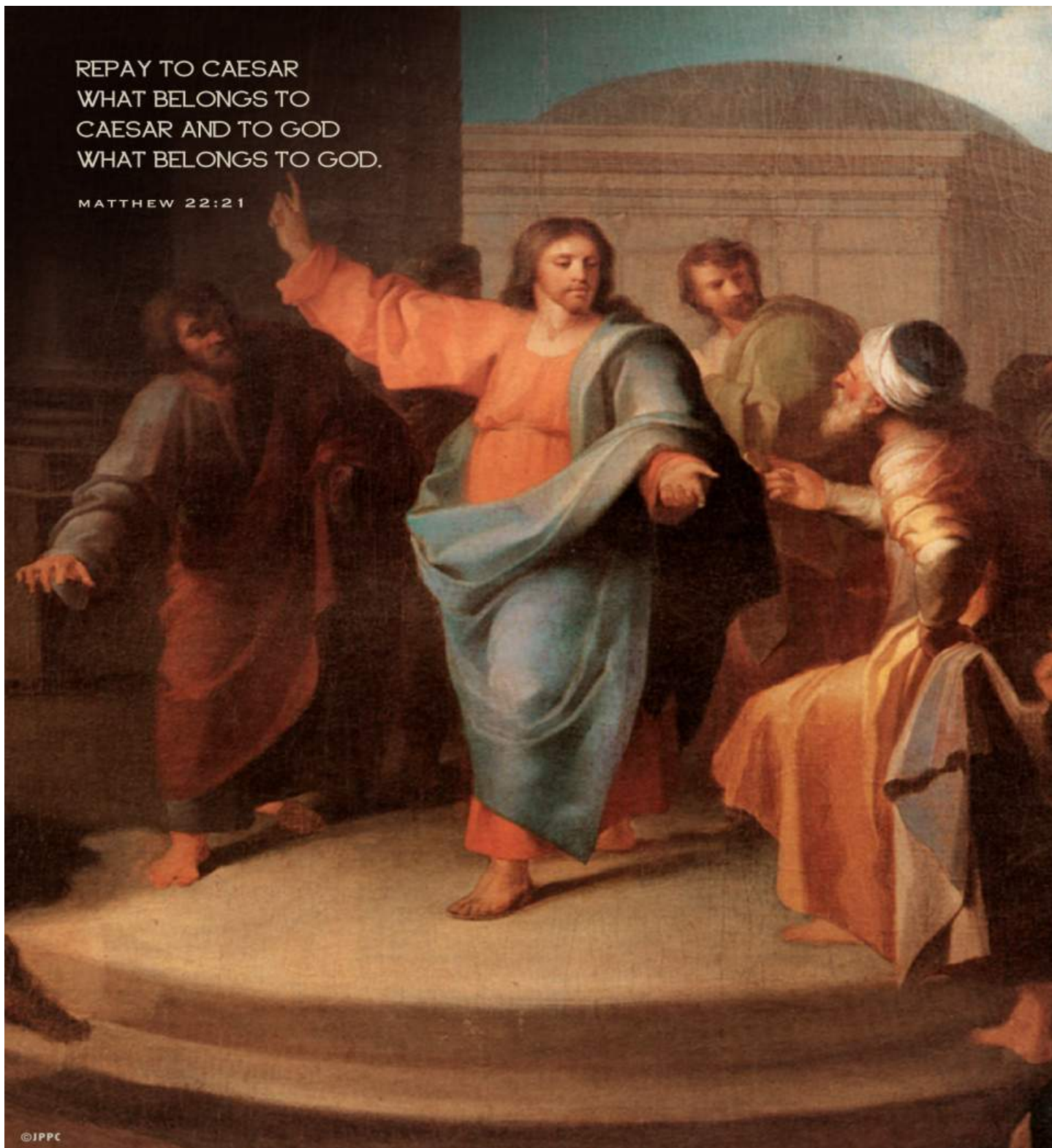

PASTOR'S CORNER

"Give to God what belongs to God."

-- Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees and the Herodians were opposed to each other. However, they found common ground in their hatred for Jesus Christ. They asked Jesus if it is lawful to pay taxes to the Emperor. It is a clever trap. If Jesus says "no" then He would be accused of sedition against the Romans. If He says "yes" then Jesus loses favor with the common people. Jesus answers by saying that if the coin belongs to Caesar then it should be given back to him. Then Jesus takes the situation to a higher level by saying, "Give back to God what belongs to God."

This week, we have an excellent opportunity to give back to God some of our time. We begin our Forty Hours devotion today. It is a time of special prayer before the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the most central and important activity we do as a parish community. It is said that to be a saint is to be full of gratitude...gratitude for the gift of life, the goods of the earth, for family and friends. Above all, we should be full of gratitude for the gift of God's love that was so deep and intense that He bled for us on the Cross. Make the most of these three days of prayer and devotion. Our needs and wants are many. God answers us in a most profound way in the mystery of His Eucharistic presence. We welcome Msgr. Stephen McHenry as our presider for our nightly Forty Hours Devotion on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday at 7pm.

We also welcome for the first time to God's altar our third grade school and PREP classes, who received the Sacrament of First Holy Communion on Saturday. They become living vessels of Christ on earth. Let us be an example for them to show them how important the Eucharist is for us...for without it, we cannot really live.

UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$422,176.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$321,321. Of the 231 families who have pledged, 162 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you enjoyed our new air conditioning system in the Church in summer. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we are in the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.

Our parish is celebrating a special devotion called Forty Hours on October 22-23-24. Services will begin at 7:00pm each of these evenings. Forty Hours devotion is an ancient devotion praising & honoring the Lord Jesus Christ present in the Holy Eucharist. This devotion was introduced to the United States by Saint John Neumann, 4th Bishop of Philadelphia, in 1853. The Forty Hours devotion consists of Songs, Prayers, Reflections on God's Word, and Benediction. On Tuesday, the closing night, there is a special procession around the Church with the Blessed Sacrament, symbolizing the call of Jesus "to come and follow me."

We are asking our families to come and participate in some or all of these devotions. It is one way to give thanks and praise to God for all His love. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is present in a special way in the Holy Eucharist. By coming to Him, we can be certain to receive much needed blessings and graces to help us in our journeys in life, especially in troubling times.

*Our Forty Hours devotion begins at the 12:00pm Mass on Sunday, October 22. **The church will be open all day for private visits to the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.** Evening services will be held at 7:00pm each of those nights.*

In this year of reviving our devotion to the Eucharist and encouraging everyone to return to Mass, we will offer weekly meditations, reflections, and poetry from various saints and authors on the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, which is "the source and summit of the Christian life." 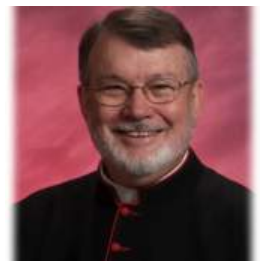

Msrgr. McHenry received his B.A. degree (Philosophy) from St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in 1969, his M.A. from Villanova in 1972, and his M.Div. from St. Charles in 1973. He completed his doctoral studies in Theology in 1983, receiving his Ph.D. from Fordham University.



Throughout his years of priesthood, Msgr. McHenry has led Retreats as well as given talks and lectures to parent and student groups. He has been involved with the spiritual formation of the men studying for the Permanent Diaconate & the formation of teachers for Archdiocesan schools and CCD programs. He has been actively involved as a Spiritual Director. In 1991, he was assigned Pastor of St. Anthony of Padua Parish in Amber. He oversaw the building of their new Rectory and a refurbished Parish Center. Presently an Adoration Chapel is being constructed; his final parish building project. Msgr. McHenry retired in 2023. Preaching the Lord's Word is his great love.

OCTOBER COUNT FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Each year (not including 2020 & 2021) each parish in the Archdiocese is required to submit an "October Count" ~ during each weekend mass during the entire month, each person is counted. There are 5 weekends in October this year, so at the end of the month, the number of people attending St. Hilary Church each week will be determined by averaging out the numbers for the whole month. It's important to always attend Church for our spiritual well-being, and in the month of October, it's especially important to attend your home parish.
