UPDATE TO THE ST. HILARY CAPITAL CAMPAIGN



This June, we have completed the first year of our two-year Capital Campaign. As previously noted, our original goal was \$350,000. The generosity of our parishioners has been overwhelming. Currently a total of \$421,276.25 has been pledged. Of that amount, we have collected and deposited \$316,188.50. Of the 230 families who have pledged, 160 families are paid in full. All of our projects have been completed...now we just have to pay the bills! I hope you are enjoying our new air conditioning system in the Church. Our children and teachers were kept cool with our brand new school air conditioning system. Our new lighting in the parking lot and the new beautiful side Church doors have been a most welcome addition as well. So, as we enter the second year of our Campaign, I am most grateful for your kind generosity. As always, the people of St. Hilary always come through! God's grace and peace.



NEW SCHEDULE FOR SUNDAY MASS STARTING IN 2024

SECOND YEAR OF EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The Church teaches that the Eucharist "is the source and summit of the Christian life." It is a living source because the sacrament of the Eucharist contains the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. This belief is not make-believe or a symbol, but based on the very words of Jesus Christ: "This is My Body and this is My Blood."

We began our Eucharistic Revival with a beautiful outdoor procession of the Holy Eucharist on May 24. May we all rekindle our faith in the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. During this year, parishes are asked to devote their attention to a renewed excellence in the celebration of the Liturgy, and cultivate a deeper appreciation for the Church's Eucharistic devotion. An Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress will be on Saturday, Sept. 30, 2023 at the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown. May the Eucharistic Revival bear good fruit in our spiritual lives as we focus more intentionally on our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

RCIA is a spiritual formation process beginning in October and ending with initiation in the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. BUILD UP THE KINGDOM OF GOD

As followers of Jesus, we're each called to take our place in the Kingdom of God and help build it up. Consider these suggestions to do your part:

- * **Cultivate gratitude...** Write down everything for which you are grateful in a "blessings list" Review it and add to it regularly, especially when tempted to jealousy or discouragement. Praise and thank God daily for whatever is on your list.
- * **Practice humility...** St. Thomas Aquinas said, "Humility means seeing ourselves as God sees us; knowing every good we have comes from Him as pure gift." Let others have the best place, the biggest piece of cake, the last word. Imitate Him who is "*gentle and humble of heart.*" (Matthew 11:29)
- * **Be ready to serve...** Any act of service can build up your parish, neighborhood, or community. Small or great, everyone can contribute something. Give of yourself.
- * **Strive for the higher gifts...** Jesus asked every one of us to love God and each other. Without love, St. Paul said, "*I gain nothing.*" (1 Corinthians 13:3) IF you have true charity, you're on the right track.



MISSION CO-OP

*Rev. Jose Rodriguez, a priest of the Missionary Fraternity of Mary, will be preaching on behalf of the Mission Cooperation Appeal at the Masses during this weekend, August 5th/6th. The Missionary Fraternity of Mary is a Society of Religious Life with diocesan right located in Guatemala City, Guatemala. It offers young men ages 17 & over a chance to become agents of change within society as missionaries. There are 160 priests of the Missionary Fraternity of Mary working in 11 countries, such as Peru, Ecuador, Italy, Kenya and the US. The Fraternity is supporting the formation of 75 seminarians in different levels of formation. Most of the young men come from very poor areas in Guatemala; they cannot afford tuition. The challenges are many, since they rely on the support of the Missionary Coop Plan to fund formation programs. The Fraternity also provides youth ministry to educate young men and women, preparing them for Church and community leadership. Together, we can offer hope for a more meaningful life for the people they serve worldwide. A **second collection will be taken up at the Masses this weekend, August 5th/6th** and your support would be appreciated. You can use the **blue Mission Co-op envelopes** in your monthly mailing packet for your convenience, or the envelopes on the windowsill (mark "Mission Co-Op). Thank you!*

What is the Assumption?

The first name of this solemnity was the Feast of Mary, Mother of God. Later, its name in the East carried over, the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of Mary. In the West, it became known as the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This solemnity celebrates the fact that Mary's Assumption is "a pledge of the future participation of the members of the mystical Body of Christ in the paschal glory of the Risen Christ." It shows that the Lord "reserves a munificent reward for his humble Servant because of her faithful cooperation with the divine plan, which is a destiny of fullness, happiness, glorification of her immaculate soul, her virginal body, perfect configuration to her Risen Son" (Directory, no. 180). The Mass has a proper vigil, and the solemnity replaces the Mass of the day when it occurs on a Sunday in Ordinary Time. What does this all mean? On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which the Church celebrates every year on August 15. Simply put, the dogma of the Assumption states that at the end of her life, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken, body and soul, into Heaven.



While this event isn't reflected in Sacred Scripture, it is clearly part of the Church's earliest observance. In the 6th century, St. John Damascene wrote in one of his sermons, "Your sacred and happy soul, as nature will have it, was separated in death from your most blessed and immaculate body, and although the body was duly interred, it did not remain in the state of death, neither was it dissolved by decay; your most pure and sinless body was not left on earth, but you were transferred to your heavenly throne."
