

PASTOR'S CORNER

**THE FOLLOWING WAS A LENTEN MESSAGE
GIVEN BY POPE FRANCIS:**

As Lent has arrived, I would like to offer some helpful thoughts on our path of conversion as individuals and as a community. These insights are inspired by the words of St. Paul: "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich." (2 Cor. 8:9)

First of all, it shows us how God works. He does not reveal himself cloaked in worldly power and wealth, but rather in weakness and poverty: "Though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor." He came among us and drew near to each of us; he set aside his glory and emptied himself so that he could be like us in all things. (CF. Phil 2:7; Heb 4:15)

The poverty of Christ is the greatest treasure of all: Jesus' wealth is that of his boundless confidence in God the Father, his constant trust, his desire always and only to do the Father's will and give glory to him. Jesus is rich in the same way as a child who feels loved and who loves their parents, without doubting their love and tenderness for an instant.

It has been said that the only real regret lies in not being a saint (Leon Bloy); we could also say that there is only one real kind of poverty; not living as children of God and brothers and sisters of Christ.

In the poor and outcast, we see Christ's face by loving and helping the poor; we love and serve Christ. Our efforts are also directed to ending violations of human dignity, discrimination, and abuse in the world, for these are so often the cause of destitution. When power, luxury, and money become idols, they take priority over the need for a fair distribution of wealth. Our consciences thus need to be converted to justice, equality, simplicity, and sharing.

Lent is a fitting time for self-denial; we would do well to ask ourselves what we can give up in order to help and enrich others by our own poverty. Let us now forget that real poverty hurts...no self-denial is real without this dimension of penance. I distrust a charity that costs nothing and does not hurt.

May the Holy Spirit, through whom we are "as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything" (2 Cor 6:10), sustain us in our resolutions and increase our concern and responsibility for human destitution, so that we can become merciful and act with mercy.


THREE PILLARS OF LENT

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving (acts of charity). Lent is a realistic down-to-earth time. It's about ashes and the cross. It's about money, food, and how I spend my time. It's about sin and sorrow. It's about life and death.

One of the Prefaces in the 1974 Sacramentary used for Lenten Masses thanked God because "each year you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery with mind and heart renewed." Joyful? That seems strange for Lent.

But it's like an exercise program. At the very beginning, you're sore all over, yet you also feel invigorated, energized, enlivened...and you really feel good about yourself. Your body is made for this.

So it is with Lent. Our penitential practices may be hard at times, but they lift our inner spirit. We're made for more than TV reruns or computer games. We are made for the unimaginable greatness of God.



SOME SUGGESTIONS FOR THIS UPCOMING WEEK OF LENT:

Sunday ~ after Mass today, consider going out to eat with other parishioners from Church

Monday ~ dive deeper into your faith; skim the glossary in the Catechism for an unfamiliar term and learn about it

Tuesday ~ pick an important issue in the news and pray over it today

Wednesday ~ figure out on which luxuries you spend the most money; take a tenth of that amount and put it in the poor box at Church

*Thursday ~ pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for those who have no one to pray for them

Friday ~ resist "idle curiosity"...don't research trivial questions or follow every browser thread, unless it's important



Our Retreat Master is Rev. Stephen DeLacy

Father DeLacy was born and raised in Glenolden, and attended Msgr. Bonner H.S. He then attended West Chester University with a degree in Accounting. He was inspired while coaching CYO youth volleyball, and soon felt the call from God to discern the priesthood. He was ordained to the priesthood in 2004 with both Masters of Divinity and Theology Degrees and assigned to Sts. Peter & Paul in West Chester. He then served as School Minister for Archbishop Carroll H.S., and then to the newly founded Pope John Paul II H.S. In 2013, he was named Director of the Vocation Office for the Diocesan Priesthood where he served for 8 years, helping to inspire other men to consider whether God is calling them to devote their lives to God through the priesthood. Archbishop Nelson Perez in 2021 named Father DeLacy the Vicar for the newly formed Office for Faith Formation with Youth and Young Adults. He continues his outreach to youth, young adults, and families through talks, retreats, conferences, and devotions.


