

PASTOR'S CORNER

"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are."

- - Sirach 3:17

Meals at the time of Jesus had very important social significance. Who you ate with, where you sat at the table, and where you were invited said much about your status in the community. The powerful and rich enjoyed these superficial games. The poor, lame, and blind people were nowhere to be found in such sumptuous gatherings.

Jesus breaks with tradition when He says, "Blessed are the poor." In heaven, you may be surprised at who sits at God's table. The poor are blessed, not because of their poverty, but because they know their need for God. The rich are condemned, not because of their wealth, but because they are indifferent to the plight of others.

"Humble yourself the more, the greater you are," Sirach reminds us. Jesus left the heavenly table, became poor, crippled on the Cross, and blinded in death. Yet now He reigns and sits at God's right hand in heaven. Jesus gives us the greatest honor - to sit at His table and be fed with His precious body and blood. We may be poor at love, lame in walking His ways, blinded at times by sin; yet He calls us to come up higher. On our way to His table, may we help each other along the way, especially the most needy among us.



ST. HILARY'S EAGLES FOOTBALL BLOCK POOL



The pool will include the final 16 games of our PHILADELPHIA EAGLES season, and will raise funds for our parish.



1st game will be Week #2 on Sunday, 9/14/25 vs KC Chiefs!





Here is how it works:
Blocks will be sold for \$80 each
(\$5 per week, for 16 weeks).
i-annual payment plan will be avail



Semi-annual payment plan will be available.

The pool administrator will randomly place your names on the 1st week's grid, until the grid is full. That grid will then be copied for all 16 weeks.

Your designated block stays the same all season. At that time, numbers from 0 to 9 will be randomly chosen for each week, for both, the Eagles and their opponent. The numbers along the top and side will be different each week, so each block has the same chance of winning. The completed blocks will be circulated through email, and hard copies will be available before the opening game kickoff.

The score at the end of regulation (not OT) will be used to decide each week's winner. The unit digit from each team's score will be used as lookups to determine the winning participant. For example, EAGLES 41 vs New England PATSIES 33, we would use Eagles 1 and PATSIES 3 as the lookups. Each weekly winner will receive \$250 sent out by the pool's administrator. We estimate that the parish will pay out \$4,000 in prizes, and make \$4,000 to offset a variety of costs, for each grid of 100 blocks. Deadline to contact Bob is Wednesday, Sept. 10th.
